

Aged Man Beaten by 3 Youths Dies

Carl G. Hinrichs, 77-year-old retired chemist who was assaulted by three teen-aged boys three weeks ago while walking in the 3700 block of South Broadway, died at St. Anthony's Hospital last night.

Hinrichs was taken to City Hospital suffering multiple cuts and bruises after being assaulted shortly after midnight Jan. 22. He was transferred to St. Anthony's four days later. He lived at 3101 Hawthorne bl.


