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ORIENTATION MEETING AT 9 A. M. SATURDAY

For the first time, a general pre-registration meeting of the Faculty is planned. It will be held in the Faculty Center (second floor of the Ad Building) starting at 9 a. m. and will go until about 12:30 p. m. Vice President D. Ray Lindley will preside and President M. E. Sadler will give the main talk. Everyone is expected.

THIS YEAR'S FACULTY LUNCHEON PLAN

Each noon on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, meals will be served in the Faculty Center with everyone paying cafeteria prices for the items of food they select.
