REGISTRATION FOR SUMMER TERM II

Registration for the Second Six Weeks, Summer Term II, will be conducted in the Science Building on Monday, July 14, during the hours from 9:00 to 12:00 noon and from 1:00 to 4:30 p. m.

It is expected that each department offering work during the Second Six Weeks will be represented in their assigned room on the third floor of the Science Building during the hours of registration.

Students who completed registration for both six weeks on June 2 will not be required to appear on July 14. Students who plan to attend the Second Six Weeks and were not in attendance during the First Six Weeks will report for registration without reference to a definite reporting schedule. Students who desire to make changes in their schedules (drops, adds, or changes of section) will also process necessary forms on Monday, July 14.

Registration for students registering exclusively in the Evening College will be held in the Evening College Office, Room 104 of the Administration Building, between the hours of 6:30 and 9:00 p. m. on Monday, July 14.

Students enrolled in Graduate School may register either in the Science Building between 9:00 and 12:00 or 1:00 and 4:30 p. m. or in the office of the Graduate School, Room 112 (Center Wing), Administration Building between 6:30 and 9:00 p. m.

Brite College will conduct registration in the Office of the Dean, Room 128 of the Graduate Religion Building, during normal office hours on Monday, July 14.

It will be most helpful if the above information is announced in your classes in order that those affected will know of the registration procedures for the Second Six Weeks.

Classes for the Second Six Weeks will begin at 7:00 a. m., Tuesday, July 15. Late registration will continue through Friday, July 18 and will originate in the office of the Registrar. The last day for changes (drops, adds, and changes of section) will also be Friday, July 18. It is expected that faculty members will post and maintain office hours to meet these requirements through July 18.
