The fourth Select Series program, "The Diary of Anne Frank," is scheduled for 8 p.m. Friday, Dec. 5, in Ed Landreth Auditorium. The Pulitzer prize-winning play had a 90-week run on Broadway. It is a replacement on the Select Series schedule for "The Boyfriend," a musical originally set for February. A limited number of seats for non-season ticket holders will be sold on a space-available basis at 10 minutes till 8 Friday night.

The theatre arts department's second production of the fall--Joel Climenhaga's "Marriage Wheel"--will open in the Little Theatre Saturday evening at 8 p.m. There will be six performances, Dec. 6, 8, 10-13. The play, a charming comedy about the marriage customs of a sect in Pennsylvania, is directed by Dr. Walther Volbach.

The TCU Symphony Orchestra will present a concert at 8:15 p.m. Tuesday, Dec. 9, in Ed Landreth Auditorium. The orchestra is under the direction of Dr. Ralph Guenther.

Dear Colleague:

Please announce to your classes the Select Series presentation of The Diary of Anne Frank, at eight o'clock Friday evening, December 5, in Ed Landreth Auditorium. This performance will take the place of The Boyfriend, which was cancelled by its producers. In The Diary of Anne Frank the committee has chosen a replacement which it believes will be of more interest than the event originally scheduled.

As you probably remember, The Diary of Anne Frank won both the Pulitzer Prize and the New York Drama Critics' Award in 1955. Since then it has been performed throughout Europe, where it has been received with wide acclaim. A dramatization of the actual diary of a young Jewess who, along with her family, suffered persecution under the Hitler regime, The Diary of Anne Frank derives its importance chiefly from its documentary nature. I have not seen it, but I note that most of its reviewers consider it highly successful in bringing into the focus of the stage an interaction of man's virtues and defects as it portrays an event which is part of our immediate history.

Do encourage your students to attend. Individual tickets are 2.50. Thank you for your cooperation.
