#### A RIGHT BUSY WEEK COMING UP

The campus will be jumping with important goings-on next week. On Thursday, March 5, the Spring meeting of the Trustees is set for 10 a.m. to be followed at noon by the dedication luncheon and ceremonies for our four new buildings.

The Board, with Chairman Lorin Boswell presiding, will hear Pres. Sadler's semiannual report which will touch on many items including recommendations for promotions in rank and for permanent tenure. The 1959-1960 budget (as prepared over several weeks by Mr. L. C. White and the Administrative Committee) will be up for approval. A report on the proposed revision of the University charter and by-laws will be made by the committee headed by Amos Melton. Other items are on the agenda.

Then at noon, the Board will join with faculty and invited guests to dedicate officially Sherley and Clark Halls, the Library and the Bailey Building. The Ballroom of the Student Center will be the place. All members of the faculty are invited to attend as guests of the University. (See below) However, it is once more pointed out that all those planning to take part should arrange to stay throughout the program. A great deal of coming-and going would be disturbing.

Dr. Harvie Branscomb, chancellor of Vanderbilt University, is to be the speaker. Others on the program are Jim Moudy, Emmet Smith, Noel Keith, Ernest Lawrence, Jim Farrar, Dr. Lindley and Dr. Newton Robison of the Amarillo Christian Church. Dr. Sadler will preside over all. 'Tis indeed a busy week coming up.

#### WE WIN CASH, MEDAL FROM FREEDOMS FOUNDATION

Everyone's right proud over the announcement early this week that TCU had been awarded \$100 and the George Wasington Honor Medal by the Freedoms Foundation of Valley Forge. Specifically, the awards came for our annual Citizenship and Career Conference for high school seniors of this area and for the annual "Sadler Freedom Lecture" given each Spring. This series, of course, was established by the B'nai B'rith of Fort Worth in honor of our president.

The Foundation awards, as you may know, are given "for outstanding achievement in helping to bring about a better understanding of the American Way of Life." As you may recall, Pres. Sadler served as chairman of the Awards Juries last year.

#### OUR CAREER CONFERENCE NETS STUDENTS

The Citizenship and Career Conference for high school seniors (see above), which we stage at midterm each year, brings a goodly number of students to campus the next fall, recent studies indicate. On the figures alone (and they're not 100% accurate) we've been getting about 4% of ALL seniors who take part. And, when you consider that some of the largest Conferences each year are in areas which do not require college training, the percentage is even higher. The boys and girls who go to the sessions on "Beauty Culture," "Auto Mechanic and Machinist" and many is "Secretarial Science," do not try for college degrees. Eliminating these rather large groups, the figures indicate we get about 8-10% of the young people who attend the one-day event. Not bad.

At Texas Western in El Paso, where a similar event is held, they estimate they get about 30% of the seniors who attend. Not too surprising in light of the fact that there isn't another college within several hundred miles. Our situation is a shade different in that respect.

With a theme of "The Inevitable Counter--Sovereign, Self and Society," annual R. E. Week on campus has been set for March 8-11. Dr. Gustave A. Ferre, dean of Cotner College, Lincoln, Neb., will speak at three Convocations in Ed Landreth. They come at 9 a.m. on March 9, 11 a.m. on March 10 and 10 a.m. on March 11.

Rev. J. W. Matthews of the Christian Faith and Life Community at the U. of T., will speak at vesper services on March 9-10 at 6:15 p, m. in Robert Carr Chapel. Other speakers representing various denominational groups will lead discussions and speak to student organizations.

Rev. James Farrar, director of religious activities on campus, invites all faculty members to observe R. E. Week in classes by either speaking on some phase of the general theme or some aspect of religion and their particular academic field. Give it some thought.
