
This office received the enclosed letter from the Assistant Postmaster General together with authorization to make re-payment to you of International Money Order No. 167618 in the amount of \$1.06.

For your information, a money order payable in Uganda through Great Britain may be purchased at this office; however, the Postal Administration of Great Britain will deduct from the face value of each order going to Uganda, a fee for its intermediary service which is two pence per pound sterling or fraction thereof, the minimum deduction being four pence.

Re-payment of the subject international money order may be obtained from the Money Order Section of the Main Post Office, Fort Worth, Texas.
