To get the location of the Moab, Utah, iron find as precisely as possible, I have obtained a U. S. Geological Survey quadrangle map which is enclosed.

Could you please get the finder to go over this with you and mark the point of find as closely as possible? The map shows Eatch Canyon, but there is also a North Eatch and a South Eatch. I assume it was picked up in the main Canyon. If the finder is not a ccustomed to reading a topographic map, I am sure you can guide him. Fiddler Butte is a lso shown.

The Crimson Mountains you referred to in our original correspondence turned out to the the "Orange Cliffs" (the adjoining topo sheet)—an understandle error of confusion!

I donated a slice of this meteorite to the U. S. National Museum. I hope to have the piece back here soon for display in the local Children's Museum with the end polished and etched.
