I have received your letter of May 20. At the present time all of my Murchison meteorites have been sold, and there is little prospect of getting any more at anything but an exorbitant price. I was offered some specimen several months back, but at the price they were being offered I would have to turn around and sell them for something like \$2 per gram, perhaps more. Since I have just finished selling them at \$1 per gram, that would not only gaul me but wouldn't set well with my customers. The material was complete specimens, with complete fusion crust, but that really seems too much to ask.

I can understand your being worried about your outstanding funds, and I want to thank you for not holding anything against me over this matter. When I get some more specimens which I think might interest you, I will of course let you know. Your proposal that you be allowed to keep them for ninety days before paying seems quite reasonable.
