We came to camp
Bullis yesterday in a
string of Army trucks a
half a mile long. And
they had to make a
good many trips. I like
it out here. Its got
big hills covered with
rocks, scrub oaks, lizards
horned toads, mesquite
snakes etc. Its hot in
the day time and we
sleep under blankets at
night. And can we sleep

out here in the open. There
are about 5000 men out here
all in tents. There are all
the way from two to 7 in
each tent. There are four
besides myself in mine.
There is a swimming pool,
theater, baseball diamond,
football gridiron, landing
field etc. So far we've
just set up tents and
cleared up. The reserve
officers will be here
Monday to take charge.
I'm sorry but I can't
possibly send but this
month as we all had
to buy some shirts (132 each)
and I subscribed for a
magazine. Lots of love
