March 17, 1936

here. The temperature gets
up around 90° every day. It's
still a little cool every night
though.

We can hardly tell when
winter is here except for
the weather. We have lettuce,
cabbage and tomatoes all
the time. What are you

Another chore to do. I suppose
they'll come in handy later

Wesco and Jewel Laze. I
don't think they went together
when I was there.

My diploma is in my
foot locker now. I brought

the Air Corps.
