Those who died: were cremated; their ashes placed in individual boxes about 1x1x1 foot and whose names were burnt-etched on these boxes and these boxes kept on a shelf in the sick bay for patients to see; which were carried with us on the train from this camp to

Nagoya Bay. These boxes inspired me with determination, when I had pneumonia in the spring of 1945, not to end up in one of them.

Sgt. Cheeseman, a Canadian - naturalized American, was a 3 inch gun Sergeant in my "G" Battery, 60th CA. We were in the sick bay at the same time with pneumonia in the spring of 1945.
