


Although Howdy Week is important it is only the beginning for you and TCU . . .



Your purple and white beanie may be bought for \$2.50 as soon as you reach the campus. It's your pass to all of the events of the week.



A quiet vesper service will be held at 6:30 Sunday evening in Robert Carr Chapel.






President M. E. Sadler and Vice President D. Ray Lindley look over their notes before going to Ed Landreth Auditorium to meet the new students on Monday morning.

You'll get a chance to get acquainted with a lot of freshmen at the Monday Night Mixer in the Student Center.



Your beanie or transfer badge is your ticket to a big feast at the Picnic in Forest Park Wednesday night . . . barbeque tops the menu.




If you're athletic you may want to play volleyball or softball, or go riding, but for the less energetic a visit to Fort Worth's aquarium or zoo might prove interesting.








Dancing to the soft melodies of Curley Broyles, Saturday night, you'll wonder how one week could pass so quickly.


... AND QUEEN

... ACTIVITIES CARNIVAL




Many booths will be set up by clubs and organizations to attract you and enlist you for their cause. This is the chance for you to set up your outside-activities for the year.
