### MRS. ALBERTA HUFF LUNGER

### Granbury

Honorary Doctor of Divinity Degree

The first woman to be awarded an honorary Doctor of Divinity degree by TCU, Mrs. Lunger holds the B.A. degree from Hiram College and earned the Bachelor of Divinity degree with honors in 1939 at Yale University Divinity School. An ordained minister since 1931, she has done additional study at Oberlin Graduate School of Theology, the University of Arizona, Goethe Institute at Guttenberg University in Germany and Brite Divinity School, where she has been an adjunct instructor.

Co-pastor of the Wooster Avenue Church of Christ in Akron, Ohio, in 1933-36 and interim minister of the Tucson, Ariz., First Congregational Church for a year, she was minister of visitation for the Hemphill United Presbyterian Church of Fort Worth in 1959-60. Well known as a consultant in the field of spiritual life development, she has served in various roles in Church Women United and been on the board of directors of Fort Worth Prayer Fellowship, Disciplined Order of Christ and the Fellowship of Reconciliation.

An observer at the World Council of Churches ecumenical conference in Illinois in 1954 and in Switzerland in 1966, Mrs. Lunger was a delegate to the Fellowship of Reconciliation international assembly in Denmark in 1965.

One of the organizers of the Suicide Prevention of Tarrant County, she has been a board member of the Young Woman's Christian Association, Bethlehem Center and Fort Worth Council on Foreign Affairs. Mrs. Lunger, often a featured speaker at religious emphasis programs on university campuses, conducts numerous prayer institutes and fellowship retreats. She is author of church pamphlets, curriculum, program materials and of the book, Roadside Tables, issued in 1960.

Mrs. Lunger and her husband, Dr. Harold Lunger, shared the 1975 alumni outstanding achievement award given by Hiram College.

### MRS. RUBY STOKER KIRKPATRICK

### Post

### Honorary Doctor of Laws Degree

A strong influence throughout West Texas in both her civic and religious activities, Mrs. Kirkpatrick is a member of TCU's Class of 1927 and one of a family that has had some 45 of its members attend the University. She serves on the advisory board for the Garza County organization for senior citizens and has held various offices with the Garza County Memorial Museum, Historical Society of Garza County and the Post Industrial Board.

A member of the Texas Tech Foundation Board, she was honored in 1955 as Woman of the Year in Post. Mrs. Kirkpatrick, mother of two sons and past-president and former officer of the Parent-Teacher Association, was one of the organizers of the women's division of the Post Chamber of Commerce and served as its first president.

In addition to her various roles of service and leadership in community affairs, she serves her church as teacher, trustee and official board member. A teacher of the same class for 50 years in the First Christian Church of Post, she also has been treasurer of the church's Christian Women's Fellowship for 50 years.

Mrs. Kirkpatrick and her husband, the late Willard M. Kirkpatrick, were among leaders in a building drive for the church in Post, where they established the Stoker Educational Memorial Fund that includes funds for the local building, Christian scholarships and other needs. She also has established the Willard and Ruby Stoker Kirkpatrick Ministerial Scholarship Fund at TCU.

### DR. A. M. PATE, JR. Fort Worth Honorary Doctor of Laws Degree

President and chairman of the board of Texas Refinery Corporation, he has served as director of the board of TCU's Harris College of Nursing since 1969 and earlier this year was one of four persons elected to the University's Board of Trustees.

A senior trustee of Austin College, where he was presented an honorary doctoral degree in 1970, the civic leader is a member of the board of Edna Gladney Home, Miss Texas Scholarship Pageant, Texas Girls' Choir and Tarrant County chapter of the National Conference of Christians and Jews. He is past-president of the Fort Worth Children's Museum, Better Business Bureau, Tarrant County Historical Society and has served on the boards of the Fort Worth Zoological Association, Girls Service League, Log Cabin Village and Tarrant County United Fund. He chaired the Centennial Celebration committee of Fort Worth in 1973.

Dr. Pate, an elder and trustee of Ridglea Presbyterian Church, has been honored for his untiring efforts on behalf of his community. Among these are the 1971 citation as Transportation Man of the Year by the Fort Worth Transportation Club, Salesman of the Year award given by the local Sales and Marketing Club and the Kiwanis Club's recognition for outstanding contribution to youth.

In 1972 the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg awarded him its highest civilian honor, the Order of Merit. He was named honorary consul to Luxem-

bourg in Fort Worth in 1975.

A member of TCU's Class of 1942 and recipient of the Alumni Association's Royal Purple Award in 1975, Dr. Pate and his wife presented their 3,000-item collection on the American presidency to the University's Mary Couts Burnett Library in 1971.

### MRS. IDA MABELLE GREEN

Honorary Doctor of Humanities Degree

An alumna and trustee of Southern Methodist University, Mrs. Green is a leader in community, state and national service organizations. A board member of the Dallas Children's Medical Center, Dallas Symphony Orchestra and Scripps Memorial Hospital in La Jolla, Calif., she is past-president of the Dallas Geological and Geophysical Auxiliary, the Women's Auxiliary of the Dallas County Hospital District and is active in the Dallas Council on World Affairs and that city's branch of the American Association of University Women.

Mrs. Green shared the Linz Award for extraordinary contributions of time, effort and benefactions to the Dallas community with her husband, Dr. Cecil H. Green. Since 1969 he has been a trustee at TCU, where he was

awarded the honorary Doctor of Science degree in 1974.

They have established prestigious endowed positions at TCU, University of Dallas and Stanford University in addition to providing for the Graduate and Professional Center of Colorado School of Mines, the Center for Basic Studies at the University of Texas Health Science Center in Dallas and the Earth Science Building at Stanford.

In addition to funding the Fine Arts Center of Bishop College and the KDF-9 Computer at the University of Sydney, Australia, their gift established The Association for Graduate Education and Research of North Texas (TAGER), a closed-circuit multi-channel television system linking nine area colleges and universities—including TCU—and seven industrial organizations. The couple also sponsored "M.D.," the award-winning medical talk show produced by Dallas public broadcasting station KERA-TV and syndicated earlier this year for use by stations across the United States.

The 20-story building housing Massachusetts Institute of Technology's Center for Earth and Planetary Sciences was funded by the Greens, and its ninth-floor Ida Green Room is a lounge-recreational room for faculty, administrators and students. Also bearing her name are the Ida M. Green Fellowships administered by the AAUW, and the three-level Ida M. Green Communication Center at Austin College reflects her interest in the arts and lead-

ership in educational-cultural work.
