JACK L. BUTLER

Jack Lawrence Butler, to be awarded the honorary Doctor of Letters degree, began his distinguished journalistic career in 1939 with the Tyler Morning Telegraph after earning the Bachelor of Journalism degree at the University of Texas at Austin. Rising from a cub reporter to managing editor during his two-year stay at the East Texas paper, he was named managing editor of the Gladewater Times-Tribune in 1941.

A native of Seymour, Butler served as information officer for the Texas Department of Agriculture and was news editor for the Austin Tribune in 1941-42. West Texas correspondent for Time, Life, Fortune and Sports Illustrated magazine for twelve years, he joined the staff of the Fort Worth Star-Telegram as a reporter in 1943.

Many of the journalism profession's prestigious awards were presented Butler for his service as political writer, city and news editor, editor, managing editor, vice president and senior vice president during his 37 years with the Star-Telegram. In 1978 he was named Capital Cities Distinguished Lecturer in Journalism at TCU, serving in that capacity for two years. During 1978-80 he also was designer and editor of CapCities Ink, the magazine circulated to 8,000 employees of the Star-Telegram's owner, Capital Cities Communications Inc.

Butler, president of the Fort Worth Press Club, was the first president of the Texas State Association of Sigma Delta Chi, and he headed the Fort Worth chapter of the society of professional journalists. The Jack Butler Award was established in recognition of his service to the Journalism Department of the University of Texas at Arlington. He was given the national citation of honor from the Air Force Association for exceptional service in the cause of national security, the Brotherhood Award of the National Conference of Christians and Jews and the Patron of the Arts award given by the Fort Worth Arts Council.

A three-time Pulitzer Prize juror, Butler has chaired the advisory committee for the Department of Mass Communications at Texas Tech University and the advisory council of the Department of Journalism at the University of Texas at Austin.

He has been president of the Arts Council of Fort Worth and Tarrant County, the Texas Boys Choir and Parenting Guidance Center. He has been on the boards of the Fort Worth Symphony, Bethlehem Center, Fort Worth Chamber of Commerce, United Way of Fort Worth, Fort Worth Foundation, TCU Research Foundation, Fort Worth Children's Hospital, Southern Methodist University and Texas Arts Alliance.
