Your letter of April 24th, has been received during Mr. Carter's absence from the State and in his behalf may I express his appreciation for your interest in Amon Junior's welfare.

Even though we realize the handicaps connected with being a prisoner of war in Germany, it is the best we could hope for and we are very happy to know that Amon Junior is alive. He is physically and mentally fit to stand the confinement and strain and we know he will make a good prisoner and if possible friends wherever he is, so we will worry about only one thing at a time.

Although, Mr. Carter has had no direct communication from Amon, he was advised last week through the Red Cross that the camp where he is interned has been visited by an International Red Cross Delegate and Amon sent his love.

As soon as his address is received and we know more about the rules and regulations concerning communications to Amon, we shall be glad to forward it to you.
