Downtown Pep Rally scheduled for Sept. 13

TCU'S THIRD ANNUAL Downtown Pep Rally will be held Sept. 13 at noon in Sundance Square.

The pep rally will be held on Main Street, between Third and Fourth streets and will attempt to recreate the magic of Frog Alley for downtown attendees as the Horned Frogs prepare for their home football season opener Sept. 14 against the Kansas Jayhawks. TCU's 30-foot inflatable frog will be blown up and ready at 6:30 a.m. to capture the attention of morning commuters. Barricades and the TCU University store trailer will be set up at 11 a.m. to block off the area before the lunchtime rush of pedestrians.

The Frog Horn will alert downtown the Pep Rally is about to begin, as festival performers from TCU's Frog Alley entertain the crowd.

The Horned Frog band will perform and the TCU cheerleaders and Showgirls will also be in attendance.

This year's pep rally boasts the debut of "Frog Chill," a soft-frozen treat made especially for TCU by the manufacturer of Lemon Chill, the Fort Worth-based company owned by TCU alumnus Charles Moore (class of '70). This grape-flavored, purple dessert will be available for rally attendees.

The Downtown Pep Rally is cosponsored by Downtown Fort Worth, Inc., Sundance Square and TCU. ♦

"Art in The Metroplex" exhibit set to open

THE 14TH ANNUAL "Art in The Metroplex" exhibit is set for Sept. 7 - Oct. 4 in the J.M. Moudy Exhibition Hall. Area artists will display their selected paintings, drawings, prints, mixed media works, photography and sculpture.

"Art in The Metroplex" is often considered a barometer of what artists are doing right now, as seen by the expert eye of a juror. Visitors can expect to be challenged and stimulated by what they see.

Luis Jimenez, this year's juror, is internationally recognized for the fundamental human concerns expressed by his sculpture.

Jimenez works in fiberglass, with jazzy metal flake epoxy finishes, neon and lights.

TCU police get new crime-fighting partner

A NEW POSITION was created over the summer by TCU police chief Steve McGee and the Fort Worth Police Department. The position allows a full-time Fort Worth Police Officer to work on campus and act as a liaison between TCU students and the Fort Worth community. TCU alum Matt Welch (class of '92) is the Neighborhood Patrol Officer assigned to TCU. Welch officially assumed his duties in July. The position is an expansion of the community policing efforts undertaken by the FWPD.

"My primary goal for this position is to work with Chief McGee and the TCU campus police about issues like crime prevention on and off campus," says Welch.

This position provides the TCU campus police department with someone who has access to FWPD equipment when needed. Welch will also work with the surrounding community and help solve problems involving TCU students.

"This position is uncharted territory for me and TCU, but I hope that my major role on campus is to serve as a resource for students who have questions about crimes and other issues involving the police department," says Welch.

Welch has already started this position on the right foot by bringing together representatives from a local off-campus fraternity, residents near their house and the FWPD to meet and discuss issues

concerning the festivities held at the house and how the noise affects the community. ♦

It's football time again!

Horned Frog football set to begin 100th year

IT'S TIME TO STRAP ON the helmets and put on the shoulder pads, football season has arrived. The Horned Frogs face a tough challenge in their season opener as they battle the Oklahoma Sooners in Norman, Okla. on Saturday. The game, which will be part of ABC-TV's regional football coverage, kicks off at 2:30 p.m.

The last time the Frogs met OU was in 1993 with the Sooners coming out on top of a lopsided 35-3 contest. This year the two teams will meet for the first time as members of two new conferences, the Horned Frogs as members of the new Western Athletic Conference and the Sooners as members of the new Big 12 conference.

TCU will open up its home schedule Sept. 14 with another tough game against the Kansas Jayhawks on ESPN2. Kickoff for the game is set for 8:05 p.m. Last year, the Jayhawks beat TCU 38-20 en route to a 10-2 season that concluded with a 51-30 Aloha Bowl victory over UCLA.

Tickets for both games are available through the TCU Ticket Office. Ticket office manager Tommy Love says that tickets for the Oklahoma game will be available through today for \$25 but there are still plenty of seats for the Kansas game. Faculty and staff members who have not yet purchased season tickets may also do so at a discounted price through the ticket office. For more information, call Ext. 7967. ♦
