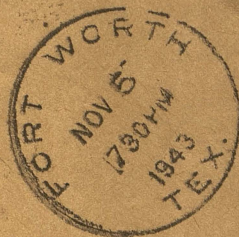

At Funeral for Nazi War Prisoner



In a casket covered with flowers and the Nazi flag, the body of a German war prisoner lies in open-air service at Camp Gordon, near Atlanta, Ga., where he was killed in an accident. Flanking the cas-

ket are fellow-German prisoners. Accompanied by a U. S. Army officer (extreme right) a German army chaplain, also a prisoner, stands ready to read the ritual.
