Dear Sirs:

The following is a status update of the litigation efforts made on behalf of the Dr. Hector P. Garcia American GI Forum of TX, Inc., (Plaintiff's) to become legally recognized as an independent state organization.

I. Cause No. 2011-CI-00727

Plaintiff's sought court relief in the District Court in Bexar County, Texas who initially granted a Temporary Injunction Order on or about February 18, 2011, pending litigation before the Court.

On August 16, 2011, in the 224th District Court, the Honorable Cathleen M. Stryker after having considered testimony, evidence and pleadings on file rendered her decision that the Court lacked jurisdiction under the Uniform Declaratory Judgment Act in that a declaratory judgment would not finally resolve the dispute whether the Plaintiff's Chapter needs to become a member of Defendants' organization.

On September 15, 2011, the 224th Judicial District Court in Bexar County, Texas rendered its Final Judgment in favor of the Defendants and against the Plaintiff's and declined to exercise jurisdiction over this private non-profit organization's internal dispute, as is the policy of the State of Texas. The Court also found that the Plaintiff's failed to exhaust these issues with the internal administrative remedies of the national corporation, AGIF-US.

The Court further ordered that the Temporary Injunction Order that was signed on or about February 18, 2011 was hereby dissolved and therefore "null and void" and has no legal effect. This was final on September 15, 2011.

Therefore, any legal right for the Plaintiff's to be recognized and operate as a state corporation independent of the national corporation- AGIF-US, expired on the day the Court executed the final judgment, or on September 15, 2011.

II. 36 USC 210

The American GI Forum of the United States is recognized as a non-profit corporation that is a "federally chartered corporation".

Under federal statute, 36 USC Chap. 210 § 21005 the statute provides that the governing body and powers are as provided in **the bylaws and articles of incorporation**.

Therefore pursuant to our federal statutes we are recognized as a non-profit corporation solely under AGIF-US.

The bylaws and articles of incorporation for the AGIF-US **do not** provide for a state corporations operating independently from our national corporation.

CEASE AND DESIST REQUEST

We have been informed that despite the expiration of the temporary injunction Order on September 15, 2011, and without regard to the federal statutes governing the federally chartered corporation- the state corporation continues to operate independently beyond any scope of authority, rights or privileges afforded to them by AGIF-US.

The "state corporation" continues to engage in fund raising efforts that are misrepresenting to the general public that they are affiliated with the AGIF-US. They continue to use the logos and uniforms which are deliberate deceptive acts.

The (Plaintiff's) refusal to proceed with the administrative remedies available to them to settle their disputes, and to continue with the aforementioned acts is evident of their intent to continue to be insubordinate to the bylaws, articles and the Constitution of the American GI Forum of the United States.

It is our intent to seek all available remedies, legal or by informing the general public in an effort to stop them from engaging in these unauthorized activities that may constitute fraud if they do not immediately cease and desist from these practices.

In conclusion, Mr. Estrada, we appeal to your good sense as a veteran and request that you refrain from any of the aforementioned activities. We also appeal to your fiduciary duty as the Tejano Democrat President.

Mr. Landin we also make the same appeal to you and request that you also refrain from the aforementioned activities and appeal to your fiduciary duty as a School Board Member for the Tuloso-Midway School District.

We thank you for your anticipated cooperation with this request, as it will assist our corporation in its unified effort to focus on veteran issues, education and civil rights.
