Pullman Company

May revenue passenger miles for the Pullman Company, available today, show that Pullman had poorest month it has had since May of 1936. Revenue passenger miles were 604,886,585, a decrease of 11.8% from May of 1937, and 9% from April.

Incidentally, the month of May seems to be the low month of the year for Pullman travel. It was the poorest month of the year in 1935 and 1936. In 1937 it was the second worst month, and probably would have been the worst had not Pullman travel declined in the latter part of the year because of business conditions.

Up to December 1937 Pullman had increased in each month of the years 1936 and 1937 over the corresponding month of the year before. Starting with December 1937 the percent of decline from the prior year has been:
