

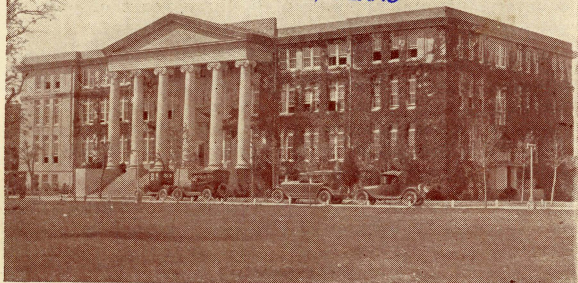

Music, Art and the Spoken Word.

All Branches Taught.

Students may enter any time.

The School of Fine Arts offers an unusual opportunity for the study of music, art and the spoken word. Its large patronage, superior advantages and strong teaching staff have given it a commanding position in this state and the entire Southwest.

Standardized Credits. The courses are outlined according to the approved standards of the best schools so that credits are transferable.

College Credits. A number of courses may be taken as electives for credit toward an A. B. degree.

These features are a distinct advantage to the student who attends the School of Fine Arts in a University where the work accomplished receives definite recognition and gives him a prestige gained in no other way.

DEPARTMENT OF MUSIC.

Bachelor of Music Degree Course. This Department offers a four years' course leading to a Bachelor of Music degree. Course includes college subjects, special training in piano, voice or violin and the theoretical branches in music.

Diploma Course. A diploma will be awarded students who have completed fifteen units of high school work, and the following courses: elementary theory, harmony, forms and analysis, history of music, counterpoint, and approximately three years of piano, voice or violin of college grade.

Teachers' Certificate Course. Students who will complete courses in elementary theory, harmony, history of music, counterpoint, piano normal, practice teaching, and two years of piano of college grade in addition to fifteen units of high school work, will be given a teachers' certificate.

Special Students. Students who do not wish to pursue a regular course, may select any branch offered, also the study of repertoire, playing accompaniments and other lines to meet individual needs.

Public School Music. Classes are offered each term in public school music. Course includes music as given in the grades and a state certificate is awarded when course is completed.

Children's Department. Children are accepted as piano pupils and placed under the instruction of excellent teachers.

Extension Service. The members of the faculty and the glee clubs are available for recitals and concerts. The School also provides lectures on musical subjects and art, for literary, music clubs and other organizations.

DEPARTMENT OF SPOKEN WORD.

Several courses are offered in this Department. Students may take either private or class lessons. We are able to offer an unusually attractive opportunity for the training of the speaking voice, correct breathing, walking and general bodily deportment. Individual style is fostered, repertoire being carefully chosen for this purpose.

DEPARTMENT OF ART.

The purpose of this Department is to provide special means for the attainment of culture and refinement through the cultivation of the powers of observation and representation. Several courses including the following branches, drawing and painting, public school art, china painting, interior decorating, art history and tapestry painting, are offered leading to diplomas and certificates.
