This is my first opportunity (and it isn't much of a one) to acknowledge your letter telling me the result of that hunting trip to Mexico. We came away directly after Christmas- had a pleasant trip up, and have been seeing shoals of people every hour since my arrival.

On yesterday Mrs. Garner and I had luncheon with the President and Mrs. Roosevelt- we were the only guests excepting the House Party consisting of the friends of the young Roosevelts- after lunch I enjoyed quite a long talk with the President. He is looking extraordinarily well.

I believe Mrs. Garner has already thanked you for the smoked turkey, but I will add my appreciation of your good thought. It is something new to my friends in Uvalde, and everyone fortunate enough to get a bite of it was enthusiastic.

I am getting settled down to harness and will be ready for work on Wednesday.
