Counter Attack On Enemies Seen

FORT WORTH, Tex., Nov. 30.—Amon G. Carter, whose resignation from the board of regents of Texas Technological College was requested Monday by Governor Ferguson, was silent concerning the letter given out at the Governor's office at Austin. Carter said he would have nothing to say until after he had received the letter.

Seen as Counter-Move.

AUSTIN, Tex., Nov. 30.—A movement considered in Texas as a counter-offensive by Governor Miriam A. Ferguson against critics of her administration and demands for a special session of the Legislature apparently began to engender its full power Monday.

Its principal evidence was a demand for the resignation from the board of regents of the new Texas Technological College of Amos G. Carter, publisher, of Fort Worth.

This follows the issuance Saturday of her proclamation offering a reward of \$500 for the conviction of any liquor law violator worth more than \$5,000 and the incident Thanksgiving Day at College Station, Texas, in which Carter was conducted from a football field after he shouted "Hurrah for Dan Moody!" while passing the Ferguson box.

The Texas Anti-Saloon League took a hand in the liquor phase of the situation by offering "to take down Mrs. Ferguson's \$500 reward as fast as she could put it up." Rev. Atticus Webb, State superintendent, said he could furnish plenty of cases of rich men convicted of liquor law violations and demanded that Governor Ferguson "make good" on the reward proposition.

Few members of the Legislature who signed the petitions asking a special session of the Legislature could be reached for their opinions on the possible connection between the Governor's liquor reward, the highway situation and the special session demand, as most of them had gone to their homes over the State.
