I was glad to receive your letter and know that you are making progress in connection with the Carillon for Mr. Carter.

It does not seem to me that you need worry too much about the plan which you suggest for the change in the tower. My suggestion is that you write to Mr. Carter and tell him what you have stated in your letter to me. If you have had any correspondence in relation to the changes in the tower or what would be necessary for the installation of the Carillon, it might be well to send Mr. Hedrick a copy of your letter. Mr. Carter told me originally that he had referred the question of the installation and the adequacy of the tower to Mr. Hedrick, and I am sure that any thing which he recommends will be acceptable to Mr. Carter.
