Mr. Hugh Smith died very suddenly in a New York hotel, as the result of a heart attack, and it was quite a shock to all of his friends. In fact, he had a dinner engagement with Mr. Carter in New York on Tuesday night and was supposed to have arrived home Thursday night. Mrs. Smith met the plane and he was not on it so she returned home thinking he would come in later. The next morning he was found dead in his hotel room. He was entirely too young to die, and one of the finest and most capable people we have known for a long time.

We are sorry that you cannot be with Mrs. Campbell and Miss Dolan, but Mr. Carter is delighted that they have accepted.
