Wednesday, March 19th at 8 P.M. in the T. C. U. Auditorium, Dr. John Garstang will give an illustrated lecture on "Foundations of Bible History".

Dr. Garstang, who is Professor of Archaeology in the University of Liverpool, is one of the most eminent living archaeologists.

He was the Director of Excavations at Jericho for several years, and has also carried on excavations in Egypt and Asia Minor as well as Palestine.

He is the author of a number of volumes on Archaeology and Ancient History.

He comes to Texas through the joint efforts of several educational institutions, and will appear here on our University Lecture Series.

Lecture is open and free to faculty, students, and the general public.

Dr. Garstang will also lecture on Tuesday, March 18th at 6:30 P.M. in Fort Worth Hall, Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary on the subject "The Story of Jericho." This lecture is also free and the public is cordially invited.
