it reached you.

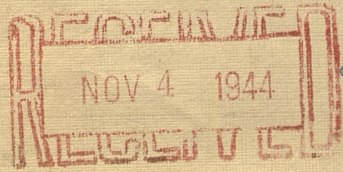
As the mother of a prisoner,
