This will acknowledge your letter of the twenty-second enclosing copy of letter from Assistant Secretary McFall of the State Department to Congressman Beckworth, and copy of your letter to Mr. Beckworth in reply to the letter of McFall's.

You may be assured that I have greatly appreciated your communication and have given it most careful and intimate attention. You will recall that I voted for the Thomas Amendment which was defeated by a single vote. You are also aware that any regulation of imports must originate in the House of Representatives and the Senate cannot act thereon until such prior action by the House.

The whole problem involved will be very thoughtfully and carefully considered by the Congress and I thank you deeply for your views and expressions regarding the matter.
