Dear Sir:

I am again taking the liberty of writing you in regard to the boys interned at Oflag 64, Germany. Would like to get news concerning their welfare if you have heard recently. The last letter I had from my son, Lt. John R. Rodgers, was dated July 10th. Inasmuch as this is almost four months ago, I am very worried and would appreciate anything you may have had since that date.

Mrs. Dalton Medlin of Bonham, Texas, whose husband is also interned at Oflag 64, wrote me that the camp had been moved to the mountains, presumably sometime in August or September. If this is so, am afraid they are in for a very rough winter, as fuel there is so limited, as well as food and clothes, and the mountains must be very cold indeed. I was so in hopes that they would all be home for this Christmas, but it looks as if that is out of the question now.

Hoping that you may have had some late word from the camp, and that you will be kind enough to pass it on to me, I am
