IMPORTANT FACULTY MEETING MARCH 20

Dr. Donald C. Agnew, executive secretary of the Southern Association of Colleges, will discuss several items "of fundamental importance", in the words of Dr. Lindley. Incidentally, Ray is hoping for nearly 100% attendance that afternoon, so, if you will, mark it down now.

CONGRATULATIONS ON THOSE PROMOTIONS

The campus was delighted with all those permanent tenure grants and faculty promotions that came out of the trustees' spring meeting last weekend. While the whole list was sent to all Texas papers, there was so much news from the meeting that most of the faculty list got crowded out.

So, just for the record and information of all, we'll repeat right here. Named to permanent tenure were Jack Suggs, Glenn Routt and A. T. DeGroot (in his new capacity as Distinguished Professor of Church History in Brite): Katharine Bratton and Ruth Sperry in Harris College of Nursing; Sanders Lyles of biology and Abe Martin, the football coach.

(The action on Martin, something new in these U. S., brought a shower of favorable comment from all over the country. The gist: TCU continues to put its athletic program on a sound and sane basis.)

There were lots of advancements in rank: Alliene Harder to associate professor; Louise Hague and Marjorie Keaton to assistant in business; Arch Wallace to assistant in engineering; Karl Snyder and Estus Polk to professor in English; Louise Cowan and Allan MacLaine to associate in English; Bitia May Hall to professor in French; Marguerite Potter (on leave this year) to associate in history; Harrison Moseley to professor in physics; Henry Key (finishing his Ph. D. work at the U. of T.) to professor of accounting; Emmet Smith (in France this year) to assistant in organ; Max Butler to assistant in art; McKie Trotter to associate in art; and Sanders Lyles to associate in biology. Mike Winesanker was named chairman of the department of music -- a big job. Named assistant profs in music were Lilita McCorkle, Katherine McKee Bailey and John Brigham. They've been special instructors.

Incidentally, in his report to the Board, Dr. Sadler had high praise for L. C. (Bowler) White, the late Dean McCorkle, O. James Sowell of development, Ike Harrison in Business and Calvin Cumbie as registrar. Most of them took over new jobs recently and have done outstanding work.

"HIGH TEA" SET FOR MARCH 25.

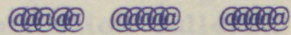
President and Mrs. Sadler will be hosts to the faculty Sunday, March 25, from 5 to 6 p. m. in Faculty Center.

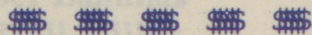
WARREN AGEE made the meetings of the Texas Press Association in Dallas last weekend.
