CAB Is Asked To Reconsider Houston Line

WASHINGTON, Feb. 1 (AP). —
American Airlines Saturday said
it has asked the Civil Aeronautics
Board to reconsider a decision deny-
ing American's application for
extension of service to Houston.

The denial was contained in the
board's ruling in the Texas-Okla-
homa case.

American said it petitioned the
board to "consider the extension
of American's Route 4 from Dallas
to Houston with the restriction
that flights serving Houston must
originate at El Paso or points west
and must terminate at Houston, or
vice versa.

"This restriction would confine
American's service to schedules
between Houston and the South-
west and West Coast, and would
prevent any single plane competi-
tive services by American between
Houston and points north or east
of Dallas," the company said in a
statement.

"With the addition of a single
airline stop (Houston), American
would provide a service of great
importance to Houston, Abilene,
Big Spring, Midland-Odessa, El
Paso, Douglas, Tucson, Phoenix,
San Diego and Los Angeles."

The city of Houston already has
asked the board to reconsider its
denial of the American applica-
tion, the company said, because it
now lacks one-carrier service to
the West.
