Dear John:

Your letter of May 10 received in which you stated that you had read in the morning paper that several American prisoners in Tunisia had been released and that you hoped Amon Jr. was among them.

If you will recall I told you at the time you and Lee had lunch with me at the Ritz-Carlton that Amon Jr. was a prisoner in Germany. As a matter of fact, we have had a letter from him dated March 20th, a post card the 25th and one the 30th advising that he is all right and asking for a list of things to be sent him. I notice you mention something about a story from Amon Jr. but I am more concerned now with getting him home than with anything else and the chances are that will not be until the war is over.

I showed Jimmie North your letter about the fact that you are giving up the Arizona trip on account of its inaccessibility to New York. Jimmie stated that it serves you right. You should have bought a place in this neck of the woods and it would have been easier and more convenient to reach. However I have already mentioned this to you once before. Anyway, we are always glad to hear from you.
