I am leaving here for New York tonight, returning Wednesday morning and will leave Friday morning on the American Airlines Southerner at 8:04 for Los Angeles, arriving there at 1:55 P.M. If you are not busy, I would appreciate you, or someone from your house, meeting me at the airport as I would like to have a visit with all of you.

I would also appreciate having you make a reservation for me on the Owl or the Lark, whichever train it is leaving Los Angeles that evening for San Francisco, as I am scheduled to depart on the Pan-American Clipper Saturday, August 24th, for the first passenger flight to New Zealand. I would like to have you reserve a single room for me, or if not a compartment and if you can get neither a single room nor compartment, get me a section.

I was sorry to hear of the difficulty at the ranch and will be glad to see all of you.
