

C. B. Mosier, Boys' Friend, Dead at 49

OKLAHOMA CITY, July 13 (Spl).—Funeral services for C. B. (Bill) Mosier, 49, of Oklahoma City, will be held at 2:30 p. m. Tuesday at Capitol Hill Funeral Home here. Burial will be in the family crypt at Rose Hill Mausoleum.

The family has asked that no flowers be sent.

Mosier, owner of a chain of service stations, died of a heart attack Saturday morning in an Oklahoma City hospital.

He was the brother of O. M. (Red) Mosier of New York, vice president of American Airlines.

Mosier was born in 1902 in Walters, Okla., where his parents had drawn a land claim a year earlier when Oklahoma was thrown open for settlement.

He moved to Oklahoma City in 1905.

Active in civic affairs, Mosier held membership in the Oklahoma City Chamber of Commerce, Capitol Hill Chamber of Commerce, Lions and Kiwanis Clubs and American Legion Post 13.

He devoted a great deal of time to work with boys in his community. Each year he sponsored an American Legion baseball team for boys.

He was a member of the First Christian Church.

Survivors are his wife; his brother, and a sister, Mrs. W. F. Caldwell of Oklahoma City.
