My dear Mr. Carter:

I wish to thank you personally and the "Star Telegram" also for your courtesies to me during my visit to Fort Worth.

As the "home of Helium" I felt assured that Fort Worth would form a Chapter in our Association and support us in this splendid movement, which is both patriotic and a commercial asset to the country.

I am going very soon to Akron, where we have a flourishing Chapter. While there I will consult with the Goodridge Tire and Rubber Co. which is very interested in Zeppelin construction.

I am convinced that small zeppelins, or blimps, inflated with Texas helium will one day be a boon to every county in the country in spraying fields, orchards and forests to kill pests, also to transport, in great comfort, tourists, business men and their agents. Airships of moderate size can be easily controlled and moored, and with a non-inflammable gas they will be as safe as a farm wagon. If Fort Worth and Akron will support each other they may start an industry and a method of transportation that will greatly benefit the whole country.

I had great success in Texas. Houston, San Antonio and Dallas join with you in forming Chapters. There was enthusiasm and intelligent vision displayed in all cities visited.

Very shortly I will start on a tour of Illinois, Indiana Michigan and Ohio, where I expect to form many additional Chapters. We wish to add greatly to our membership before the next Convention in October, because I am assured by Congressmen that a country-wide expression by the people will greatly expedite the passage of laws for the control of aeronautics, and will support the Post Office Department in extending its air mail facilities.


