Dear Mrs. Warren:

This morning, Mr. Carter received a letter from Mrs. Evelyn Ranck, Austin, Texas, enclosing a print of a picture she had received in which your husband, her husband and Amon Junior, as well as several other prisoners of war in Oflag 64 were shown. Words cannot say how delighted we were to get a copy of this picture and Mr. Carter is exceedingly anxious to get other copies of the picture, since it has been copied once and each time a picture is reproduced it loses some of the features. Therefore, I wired Mrs. Ranck to call Mr. Carter collect and she advised us that you had the negative from which the copies were made. I have tried to telephone you but no phone is listed in your name.

Would you be good enough to let us borrow the negative to have copies made of the picture so it can be sent to Amon Junior's mother and his sister? I would like a copy and also to send to the other boys' families in the pictures. The negative will be returned the same day it is received here. If you are not willing to do this, could you have about a dozen prints made and send them with a memorandum of the bill?
