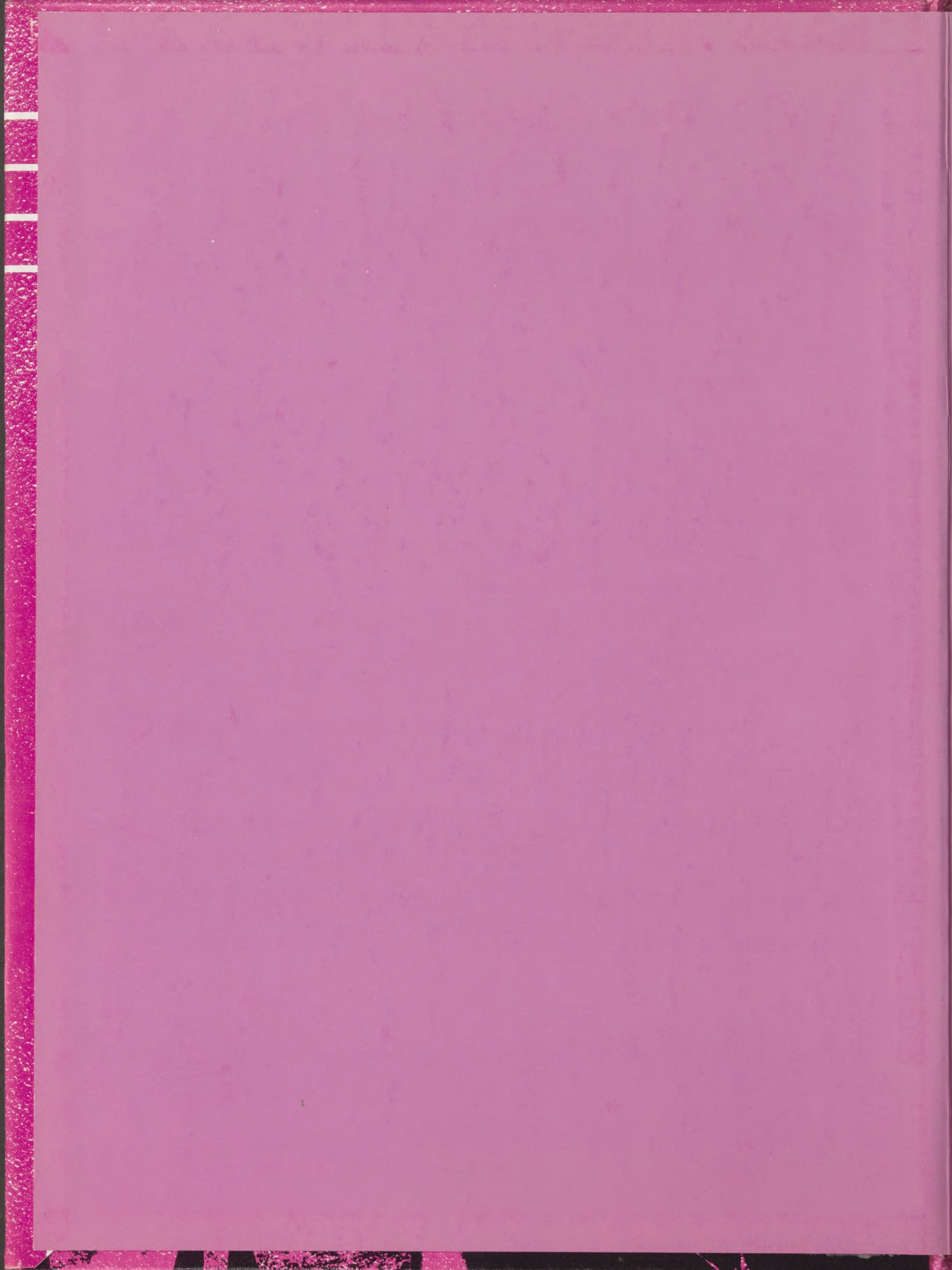
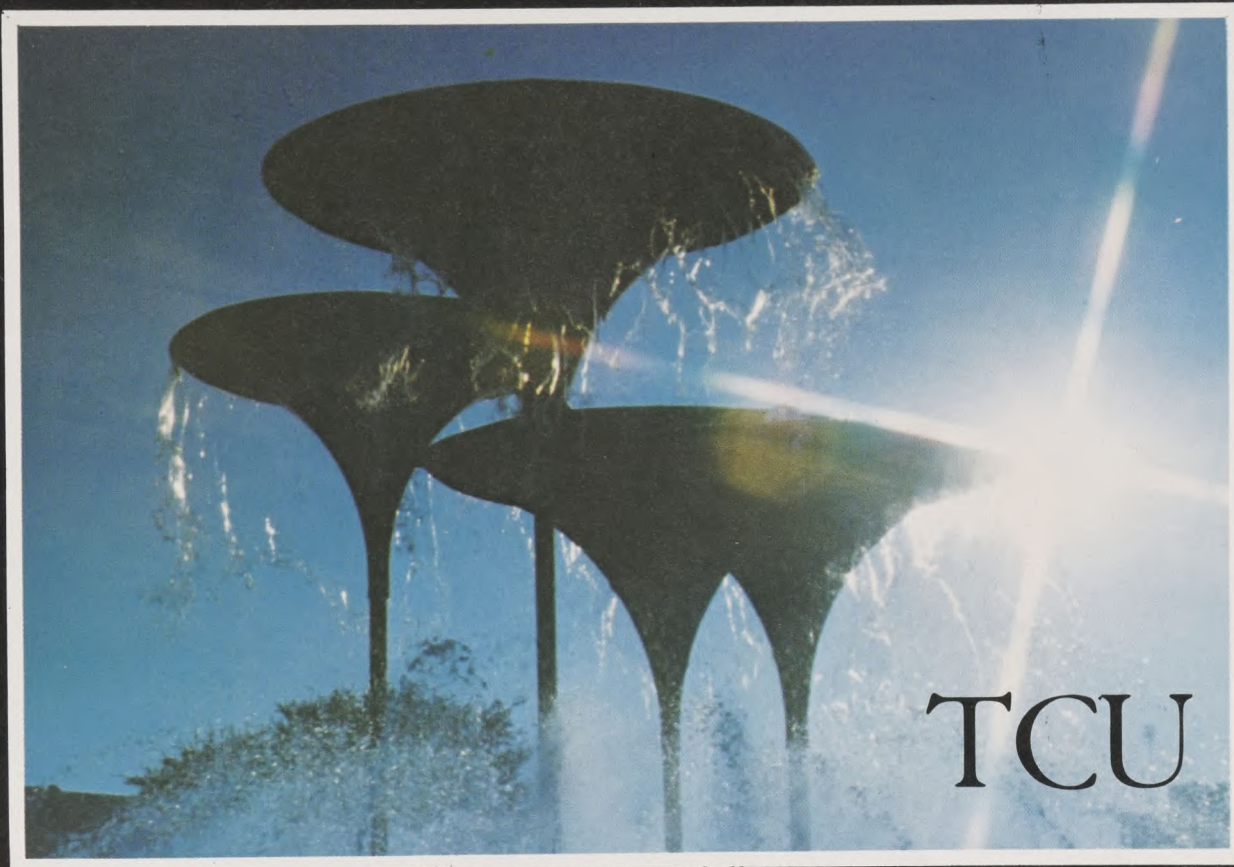

STANDING BY THE FOUNTAIN, these two girls seem like they certainly have something to grin about!

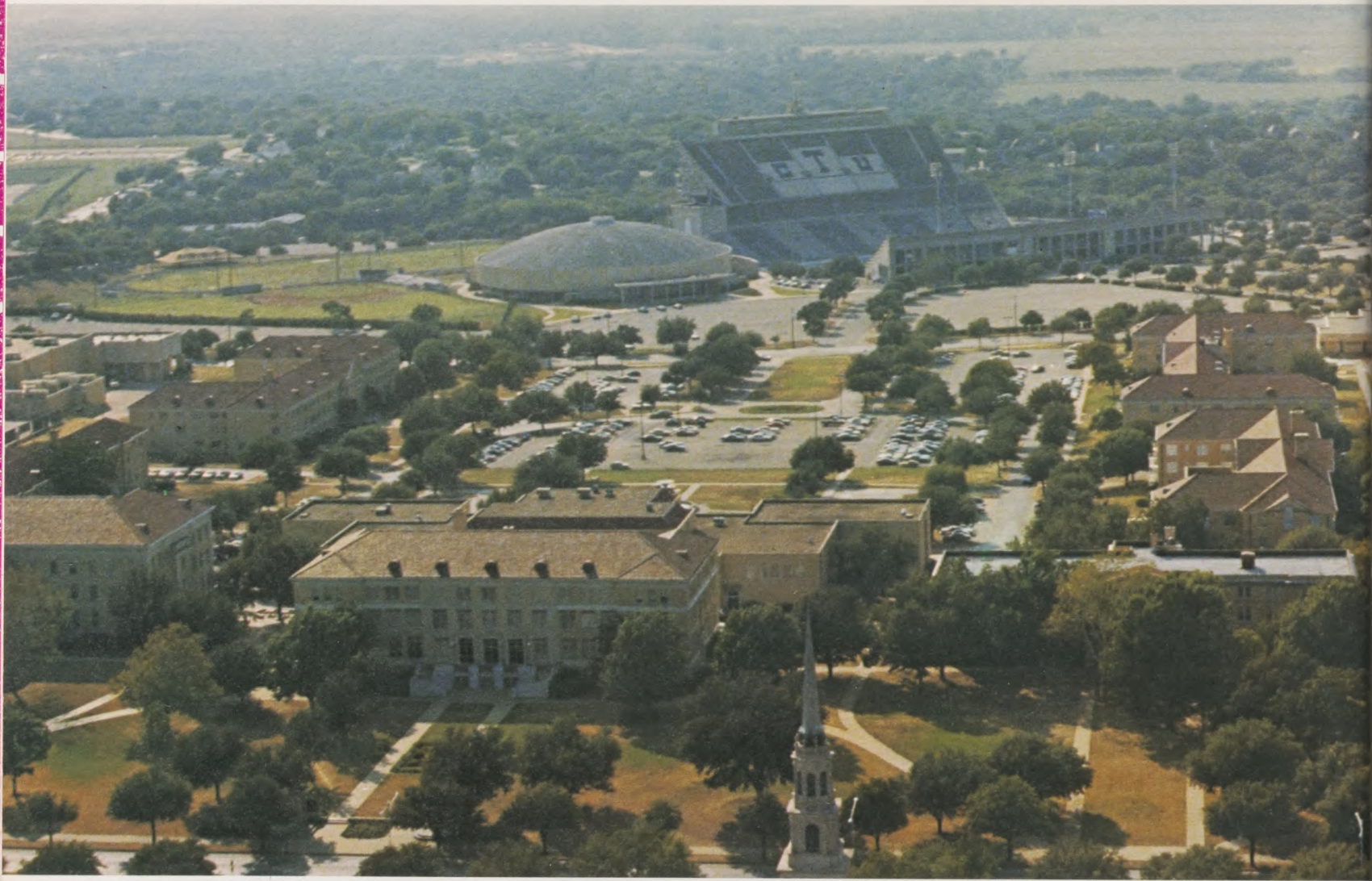

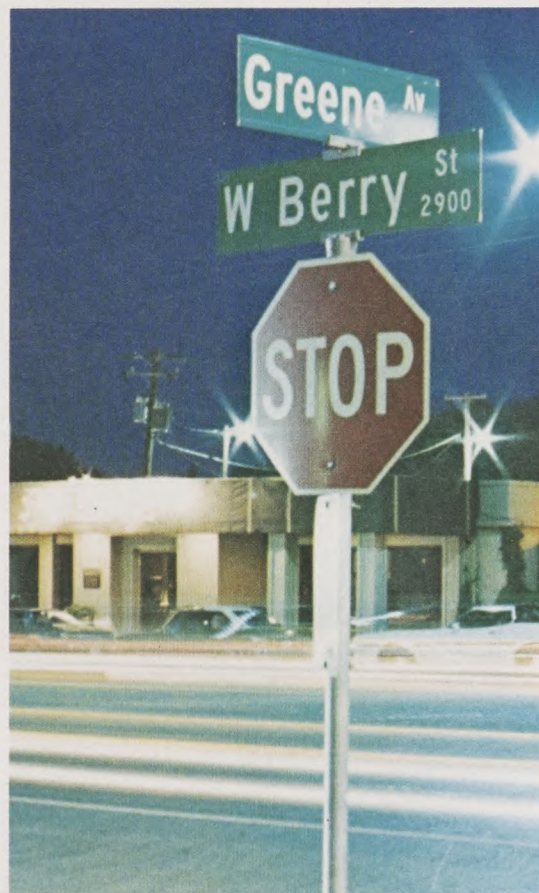
COWTOWN. Where the west begins. Every TCU student encounters Fort Worth intimately every day. Without venturing far; we are entertained, governed, serviced.

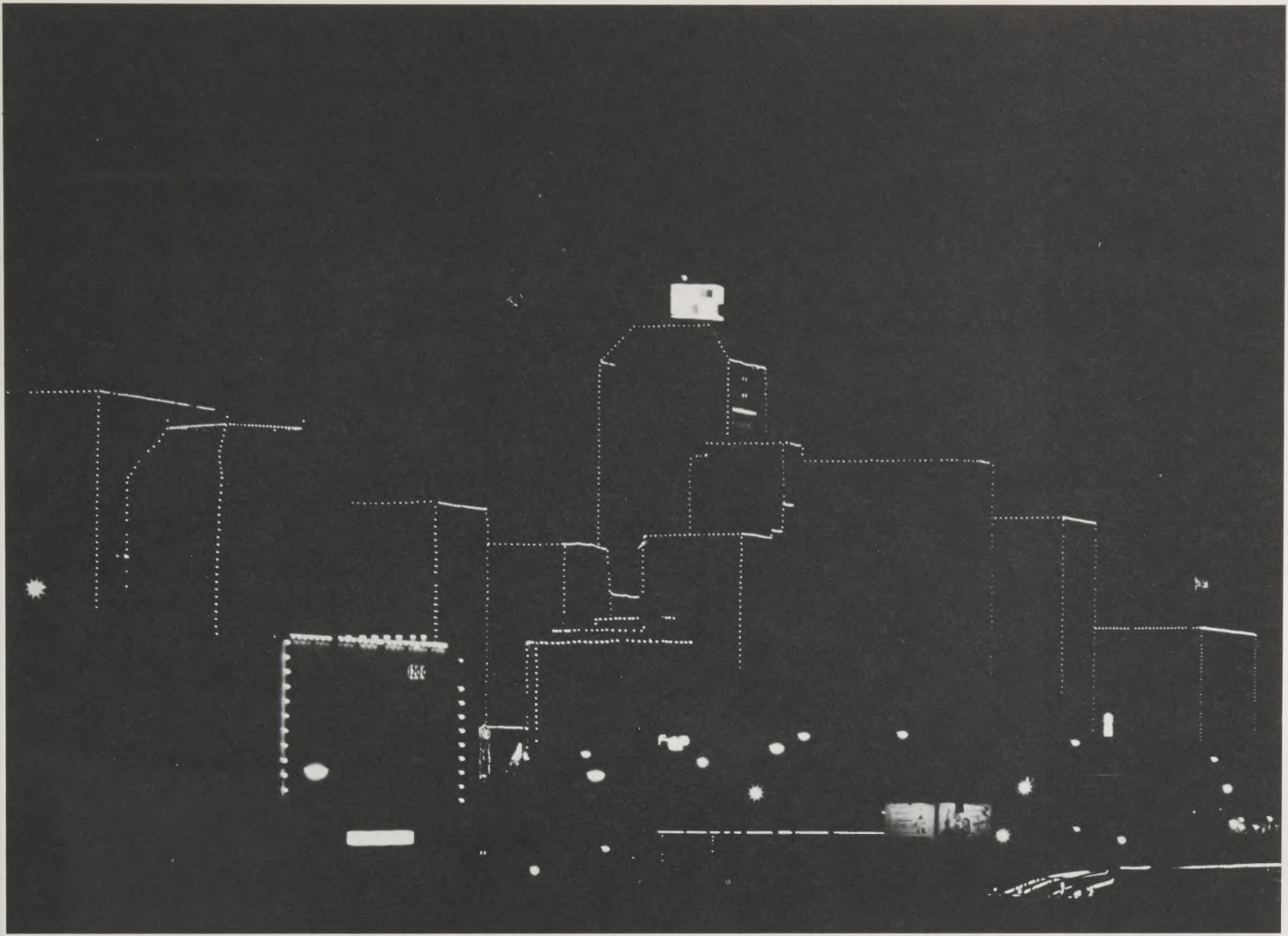
THE TCU THEATRE is just about the only place you can go to see a midnight movie for only \$1.00, which students on a strict budget thoroughly enjoy.

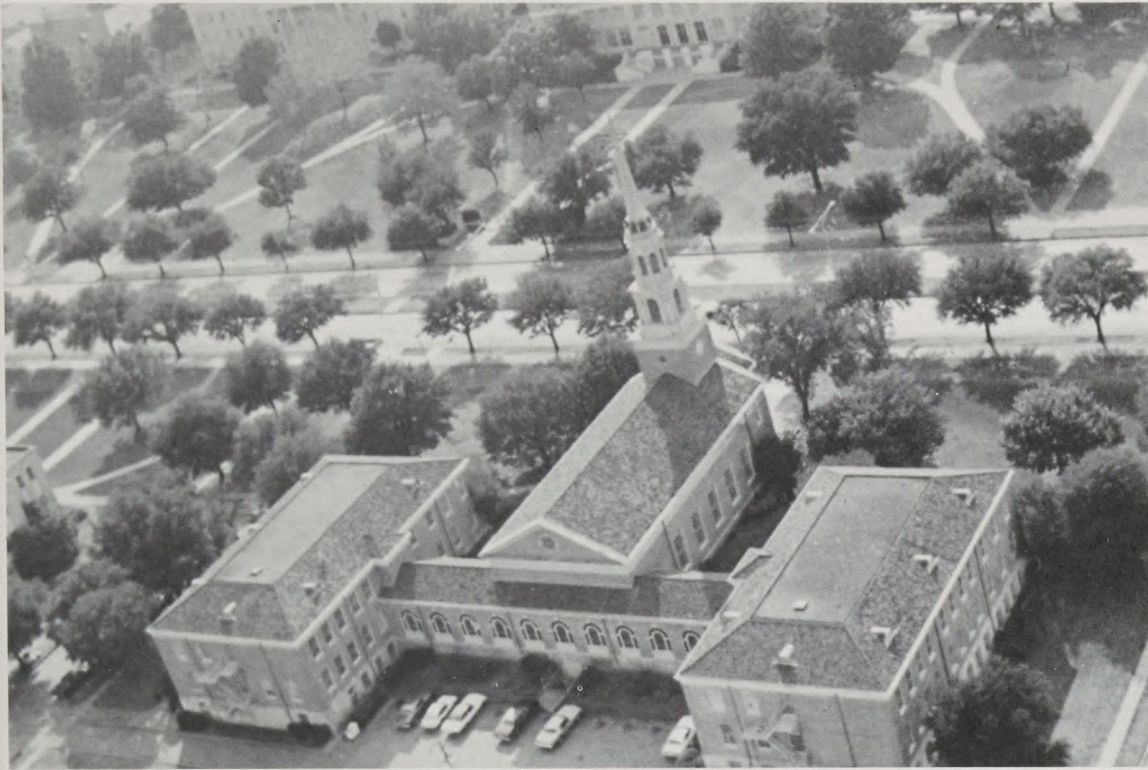

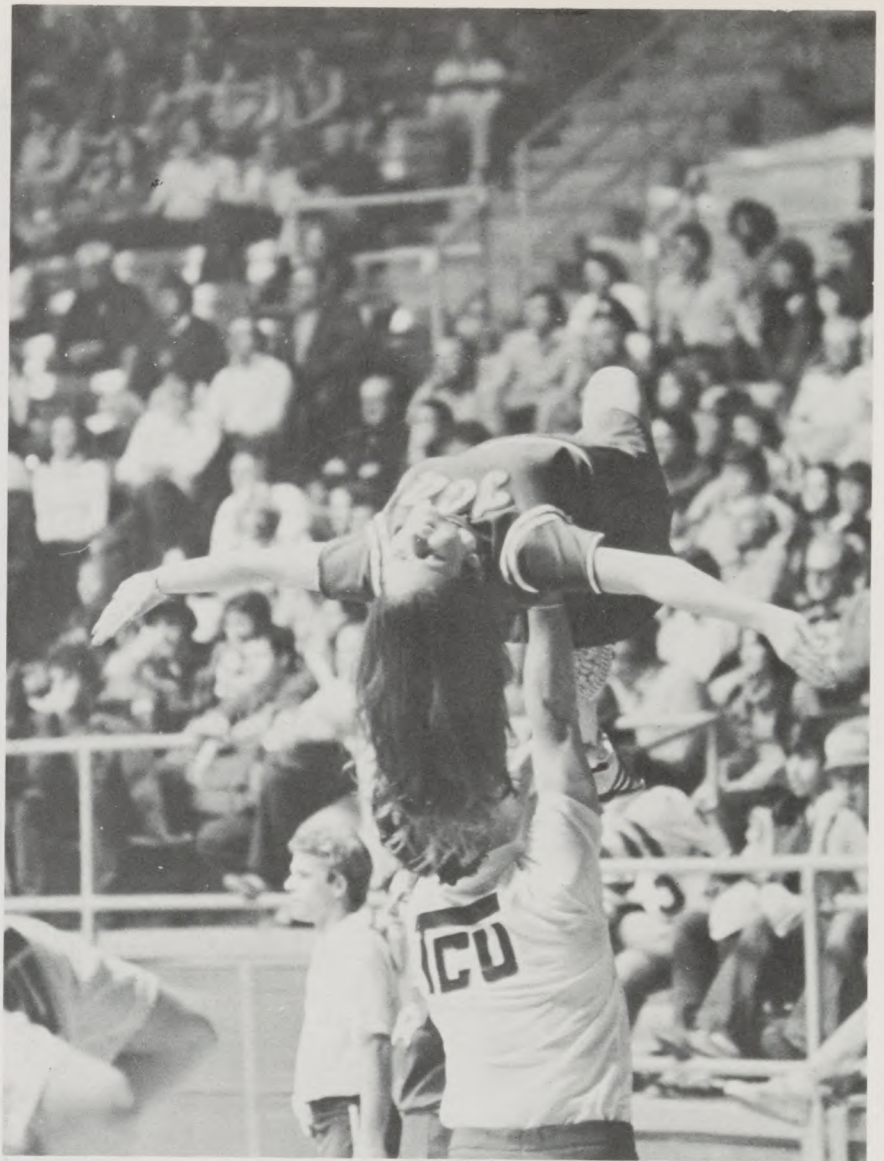

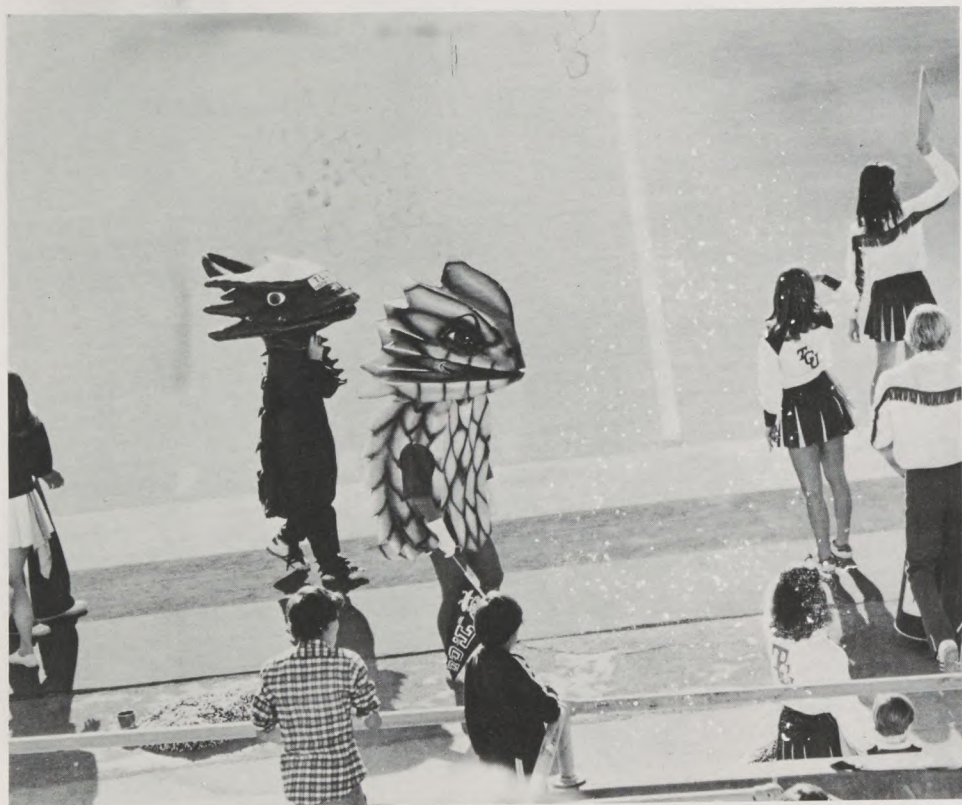
Purple was indeed pushed all the way for our 1978 HOMECOMING.

FORD spent most of his time with students in various classrooms. Jarvis Hall gave him a special reception.

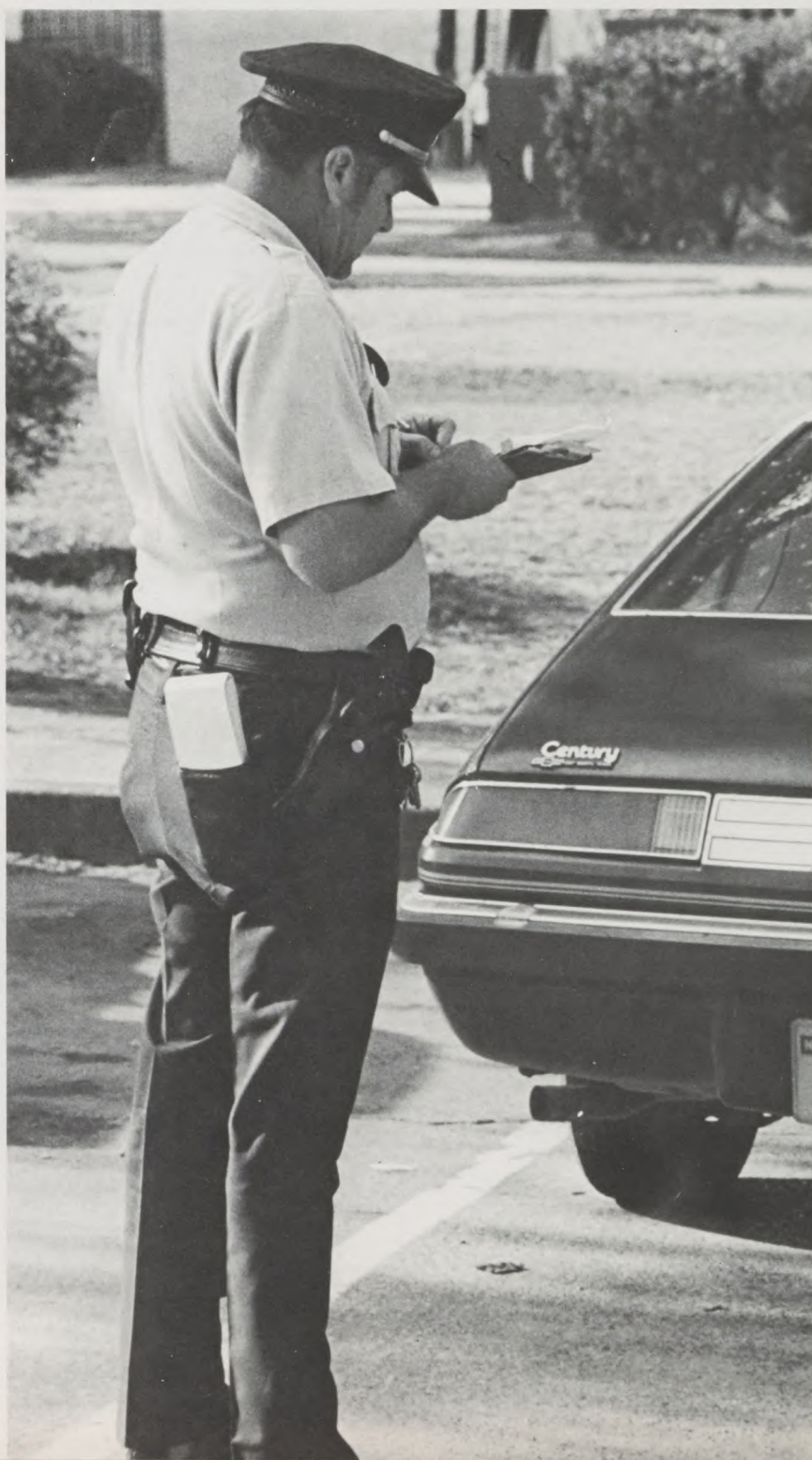

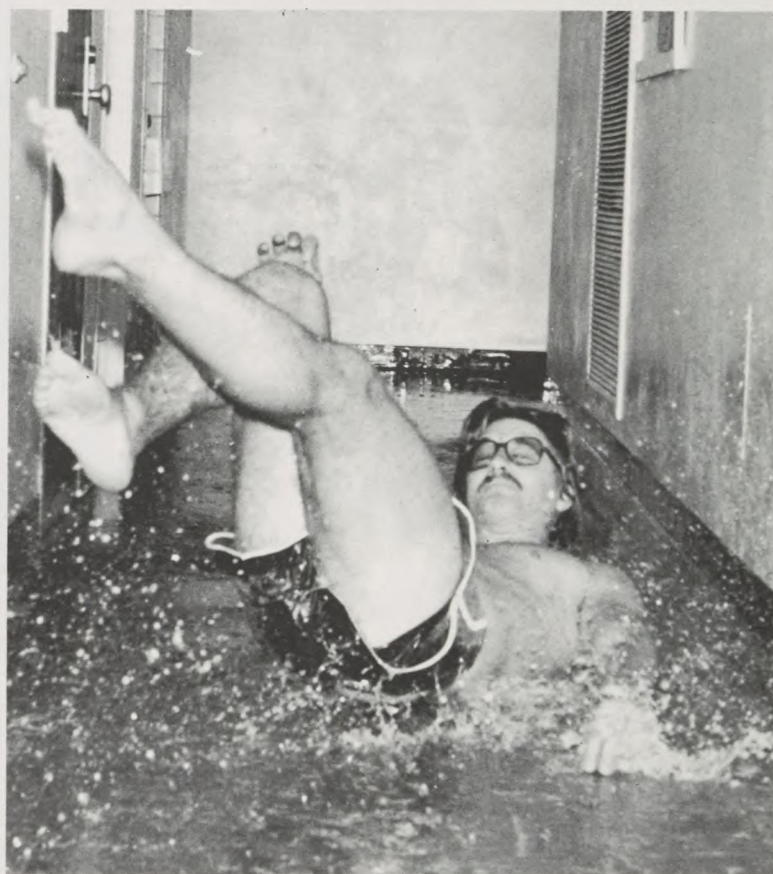

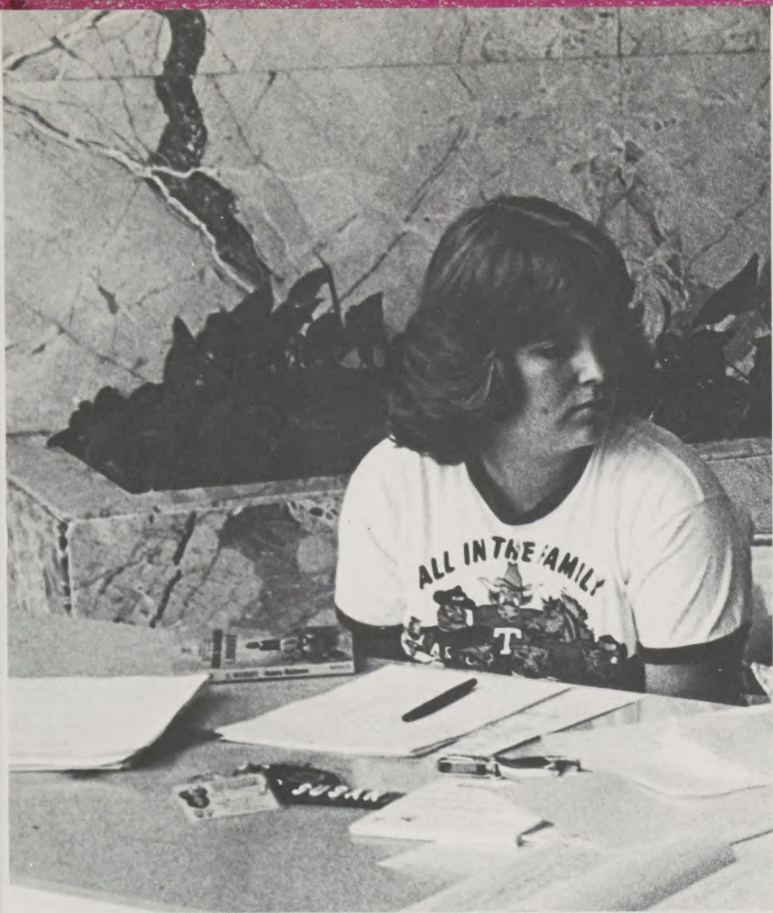

The Purpose is fun. Phi Kappa Sigma's Man Day is one of the first Fall events.



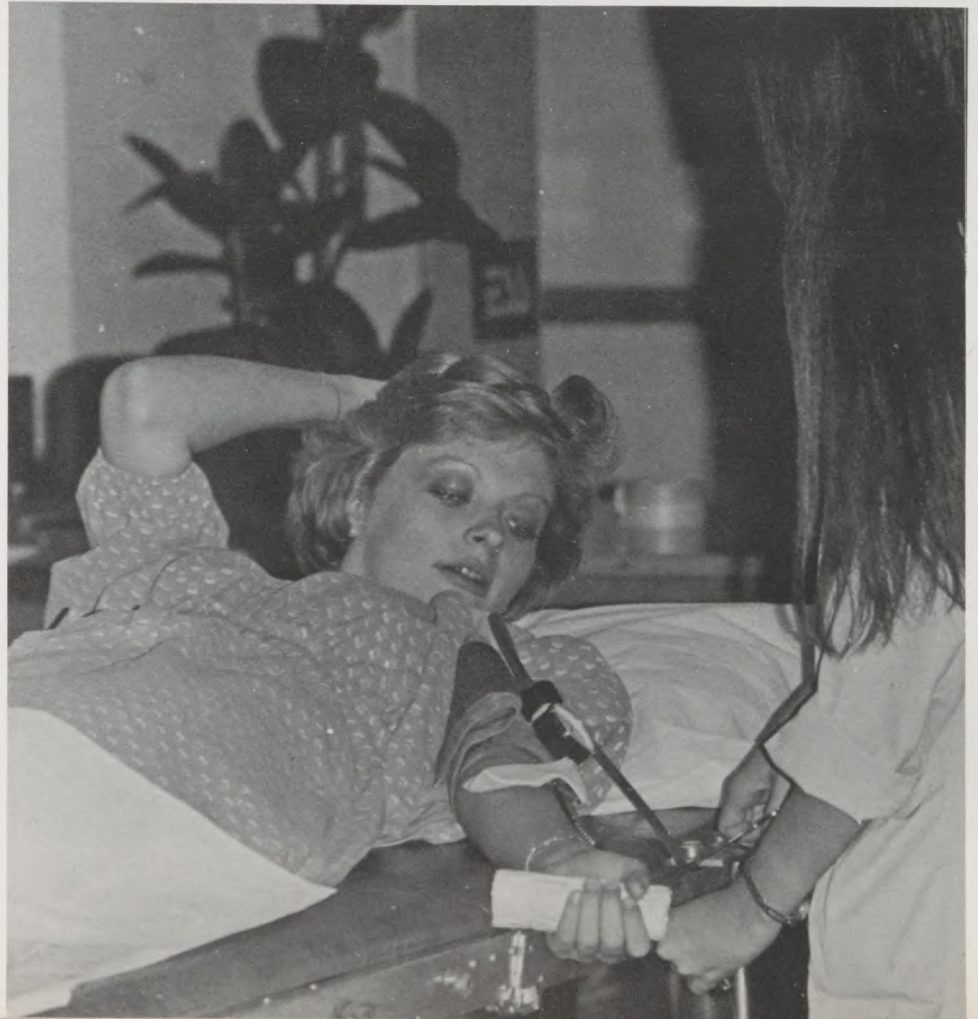


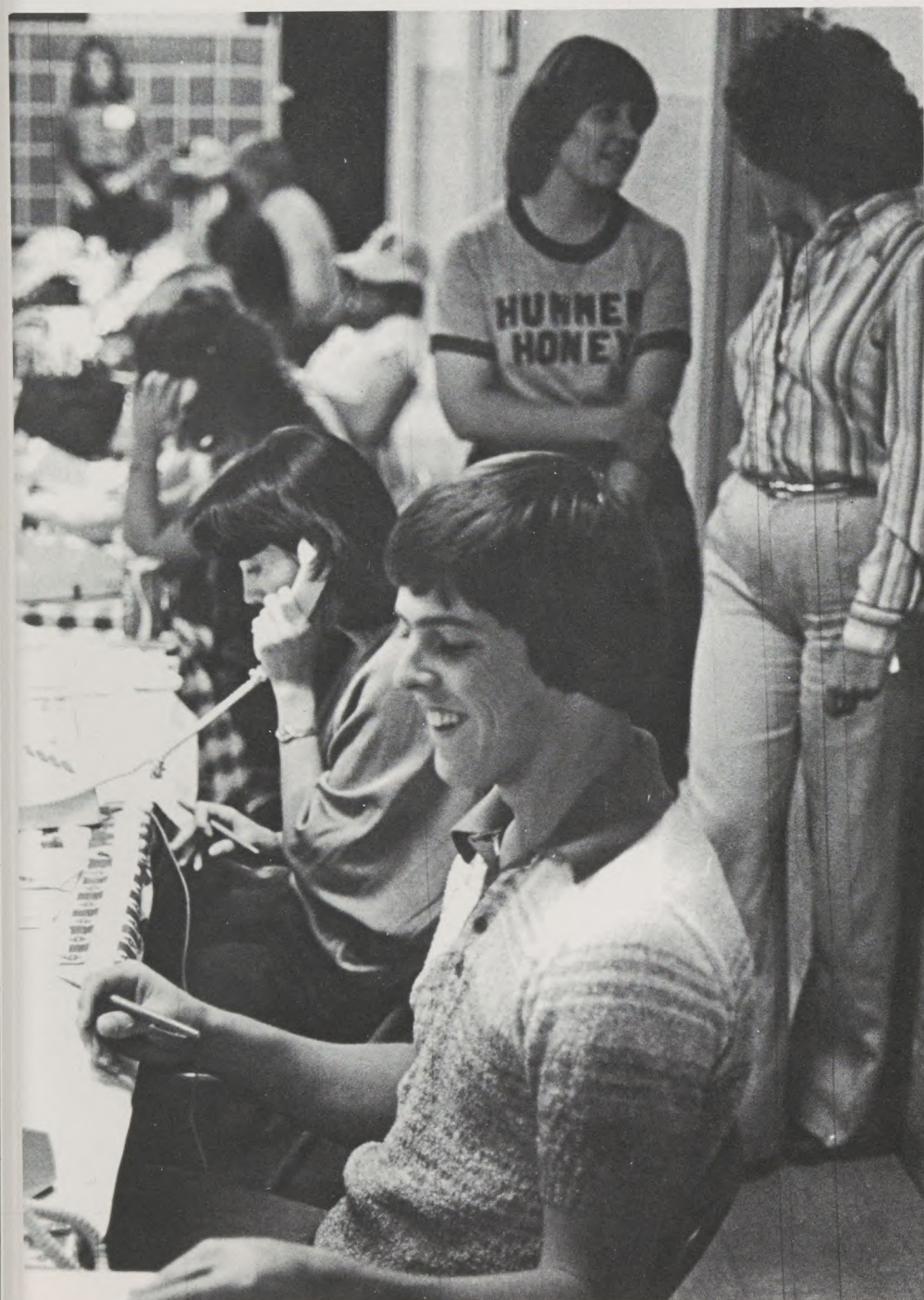

Helping fill the Carter Blood Bank is also one of TCU's Civic projects.

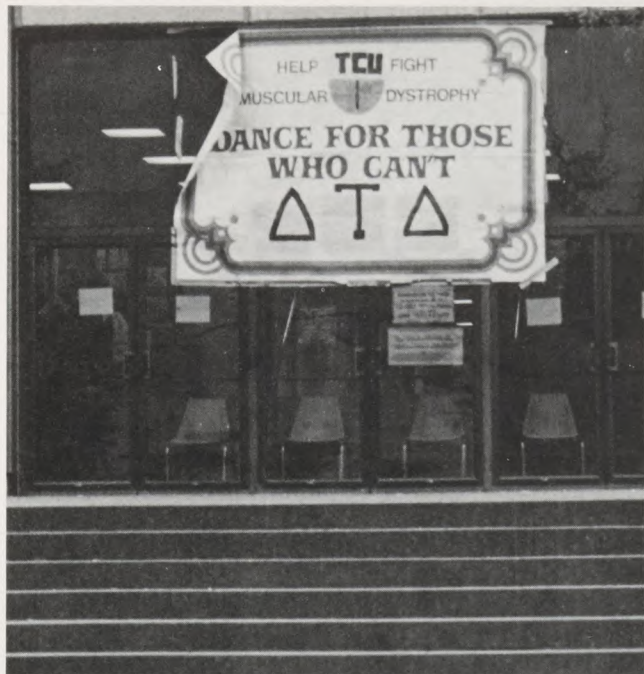

Next page, Melinda Tadlock is working for precision and aplomb.

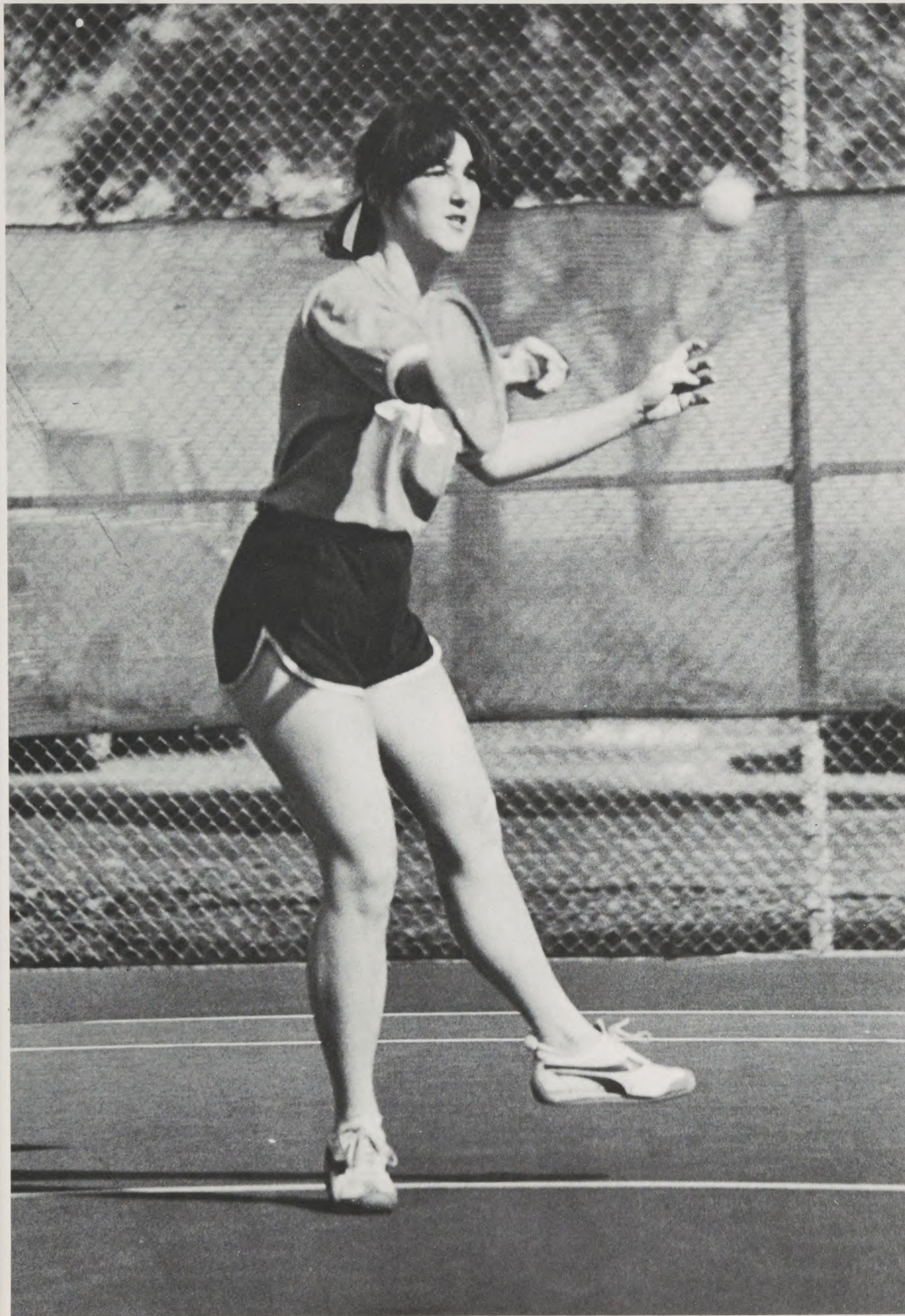

Dry Look Right In Style

Head Football Coach, F.A. Dry signed up with TCU for a new six-year contract. Dry has stabilized the Frogs and further time is needed to strengthen on-going programs. For those who keep score, the record is the same as last year, 2-9. But scores were closer this year.





Baylor's game was close, and the 28-21 loss was a big improvement over last year when the Frogs scored only 9 points. Texas Tech is another example of how TCU closed the gap from a 32 point difference to a 10 point difference this year. At least 20 players were injured while TCU was trying to win conference games. In Houston's game, one player was out with pneumonia and his replacement had only two days to practice. Some times as many as six freshmen started a game, whereas TCU's opponents started no freshmen.

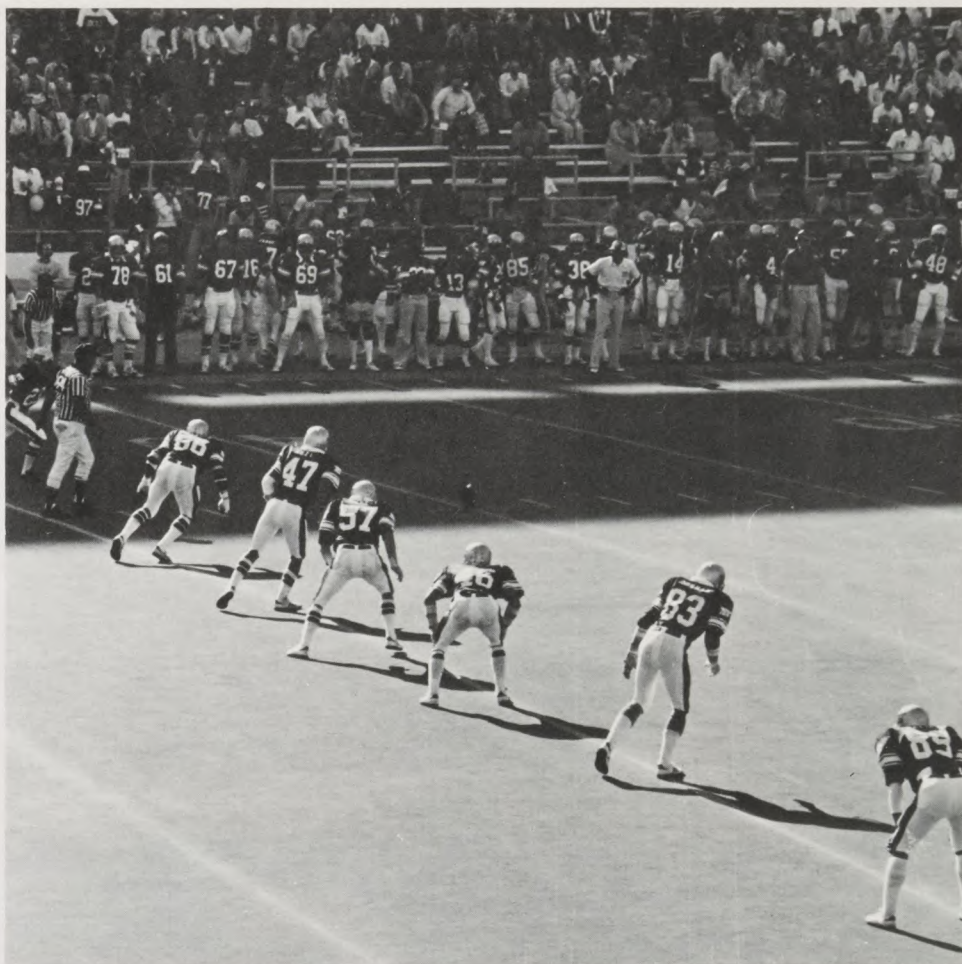
Yesterday's freshmen are today's sophomores and our young Frogs will be older and wiser than most teams next year.

And as if that wasn't enough, number 79 will be a commercial artist in the off-season.

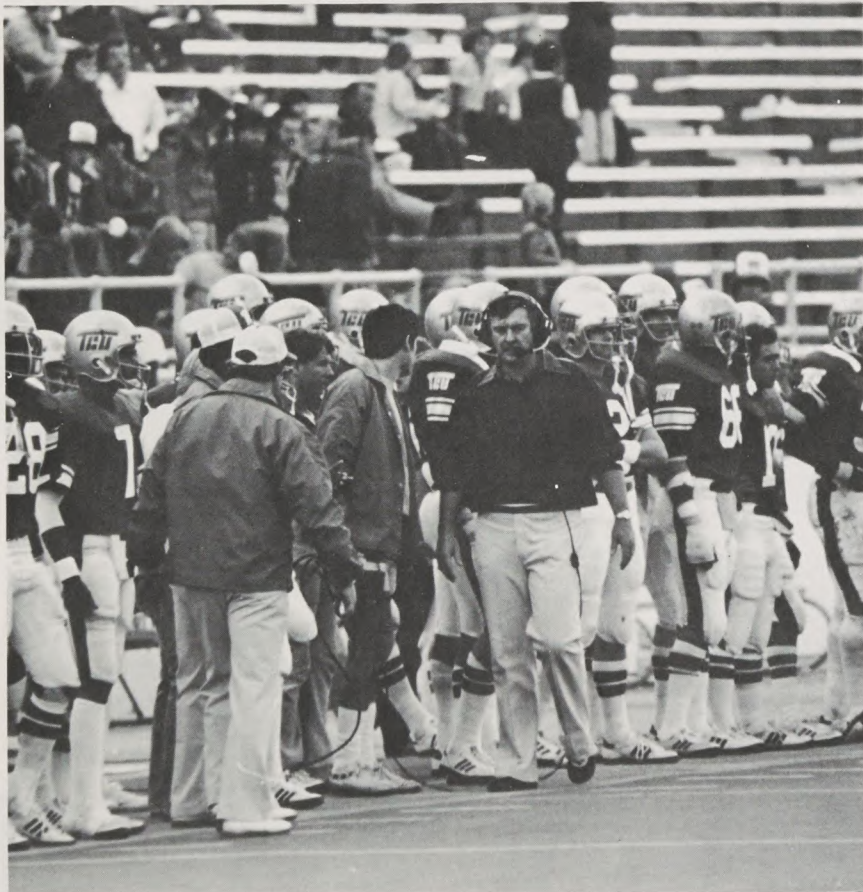
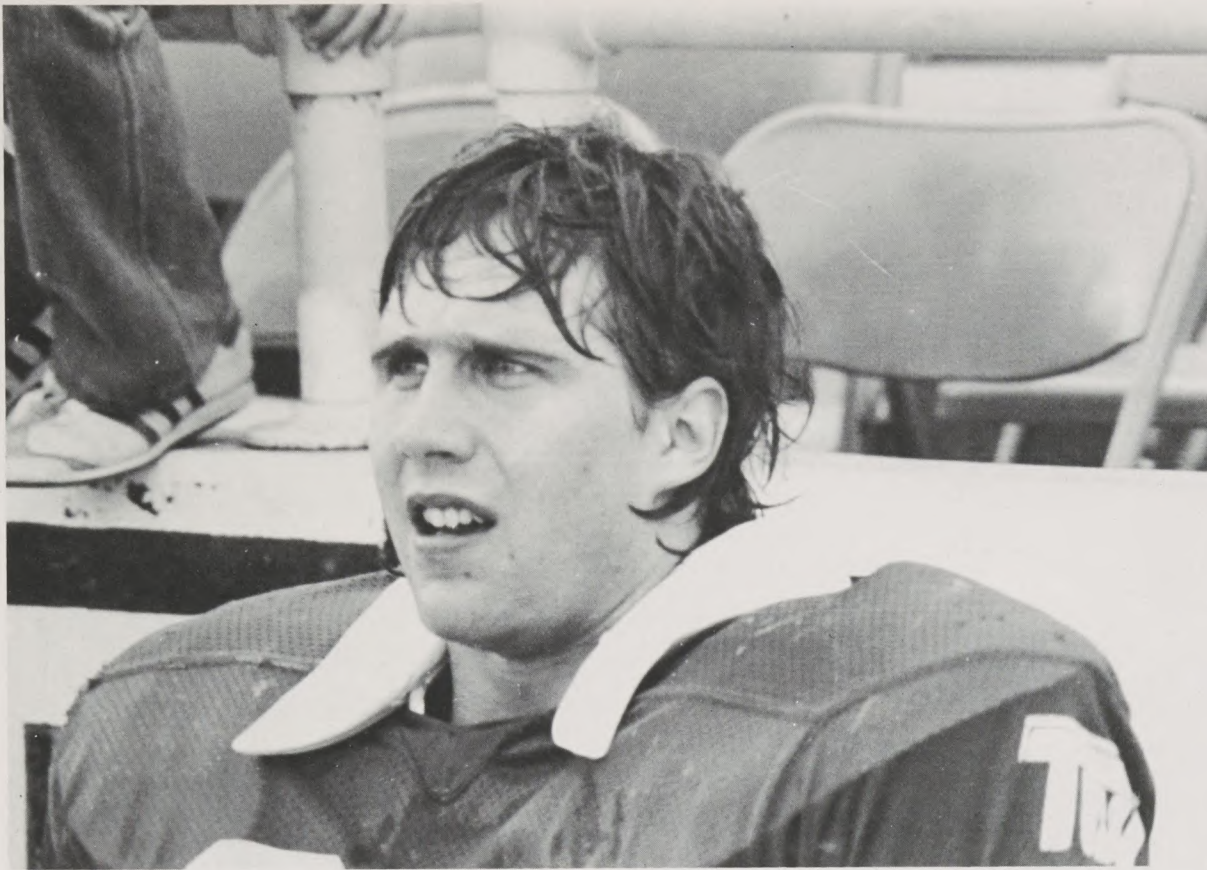

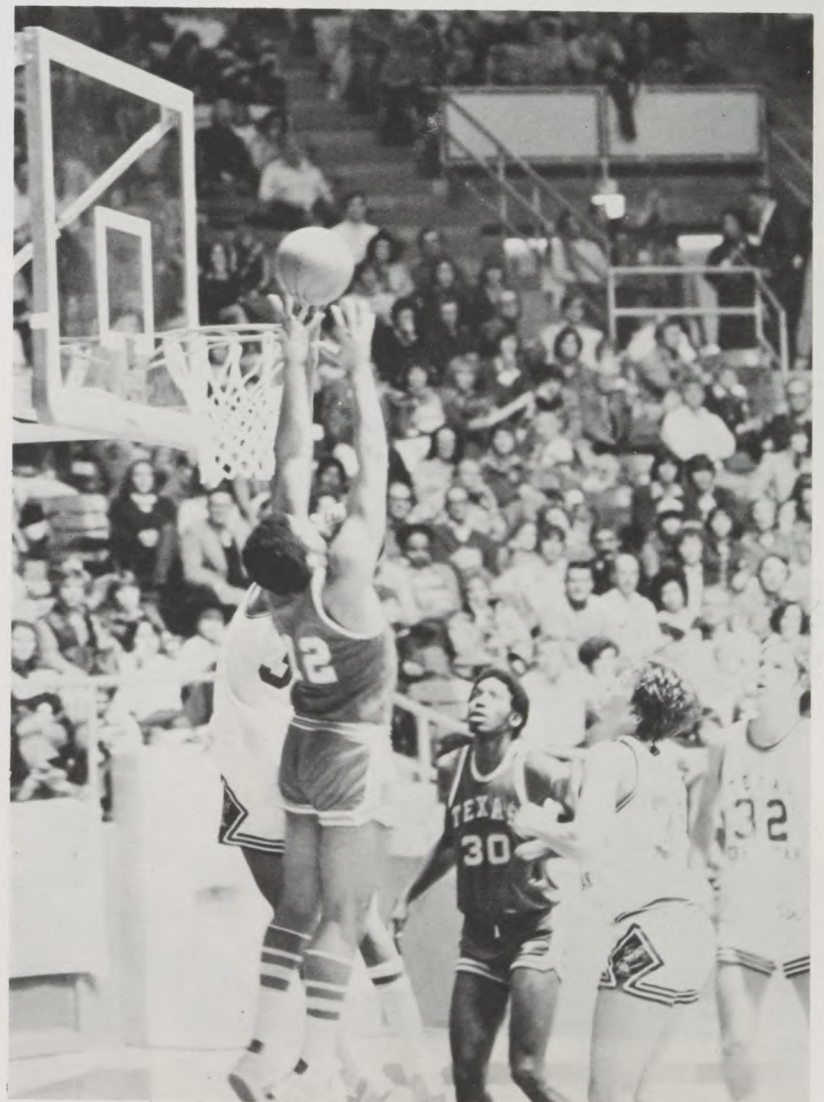

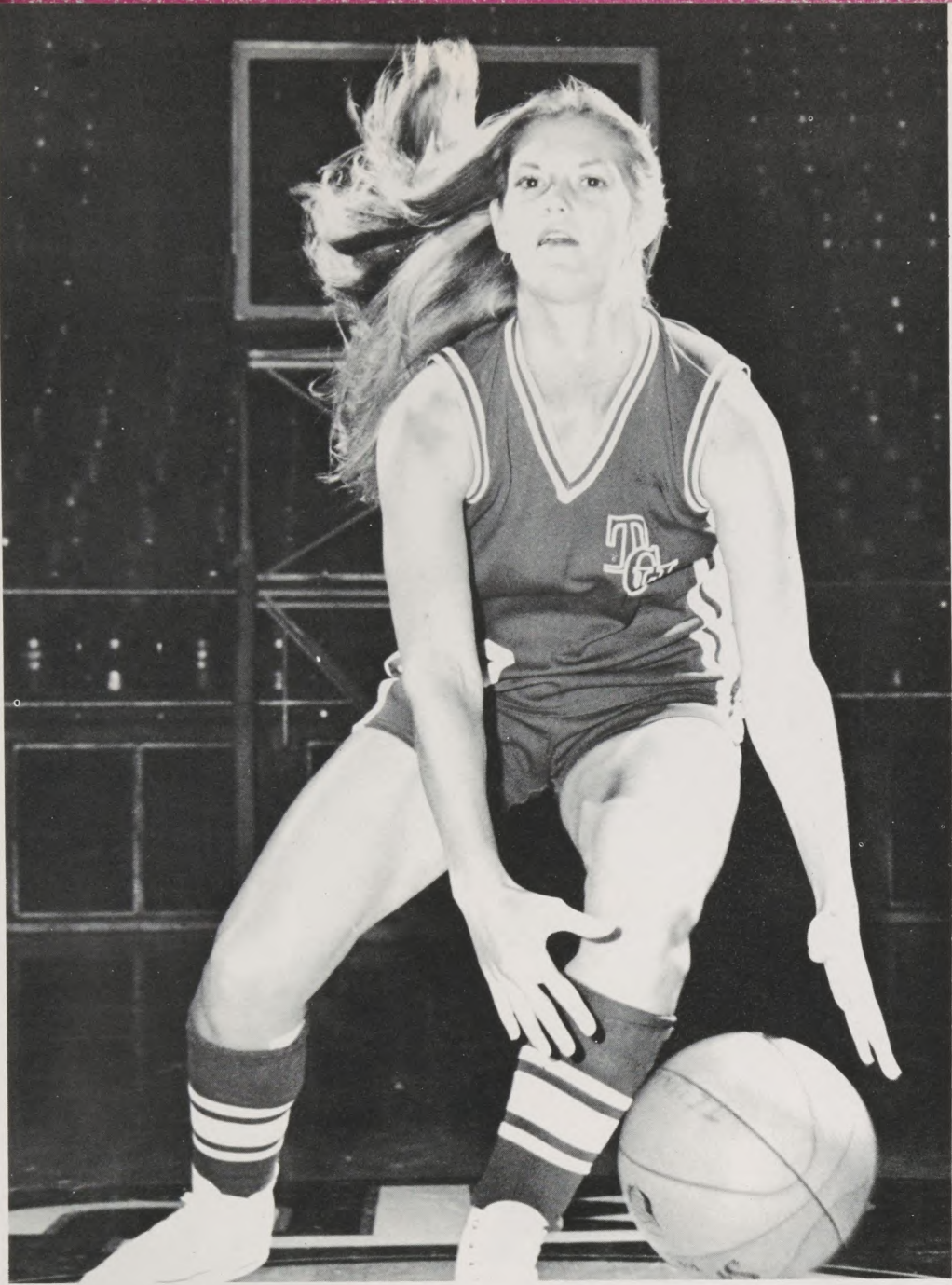

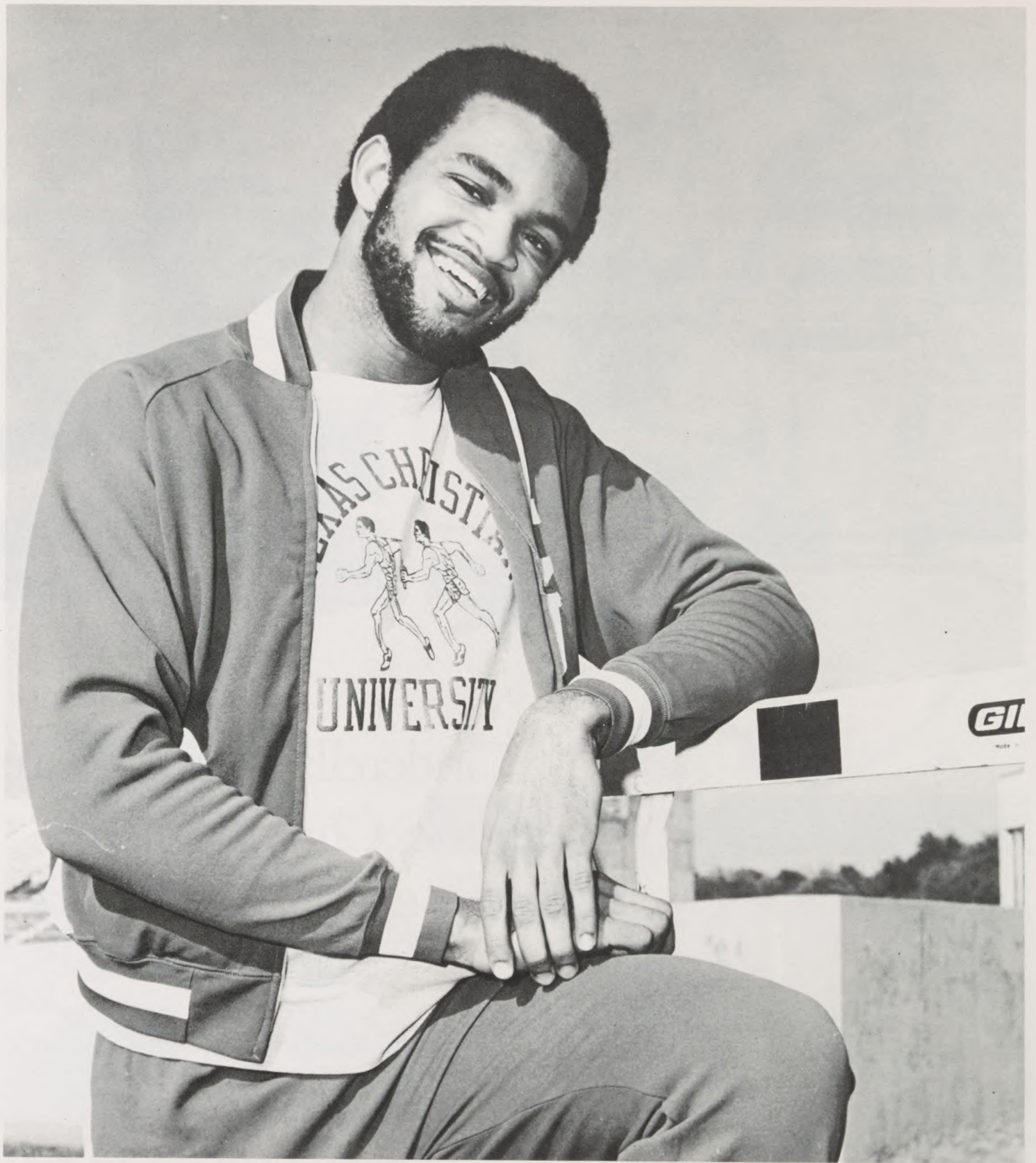
Cinderella Team Wins State Championship

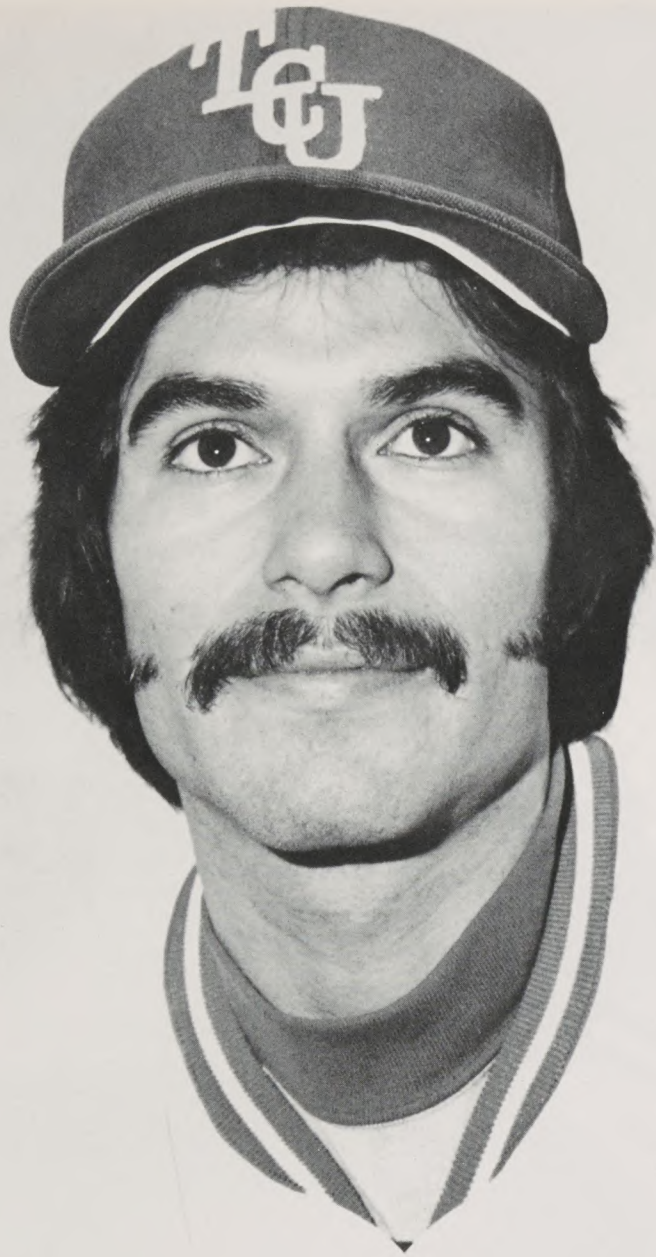
Young Team Improves Record

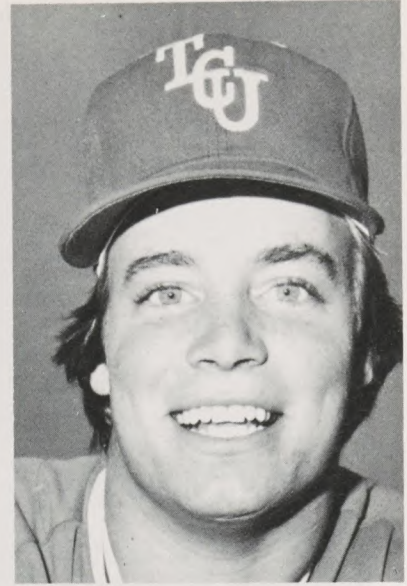

MOST VALUABLE PLAYER was served to Angela Bar-tzen who also is rated #1 in singles and doubles at TCU.

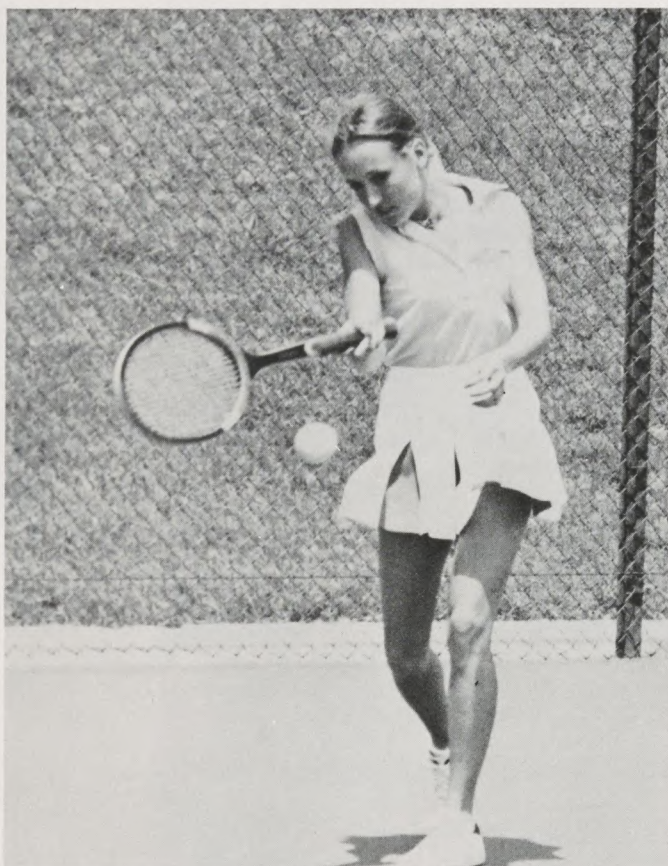

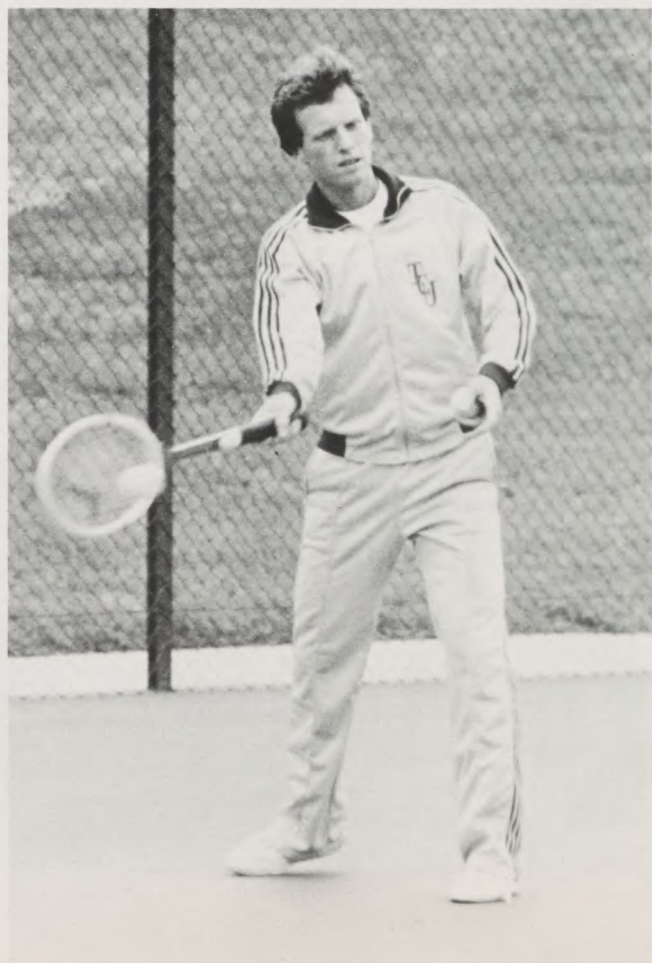


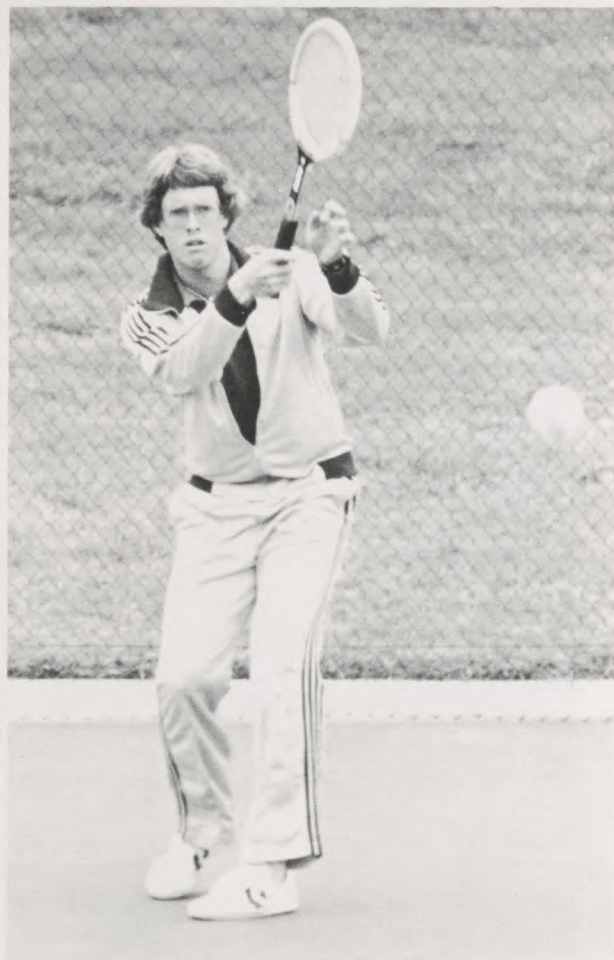
The Love Game Best on Decoralt

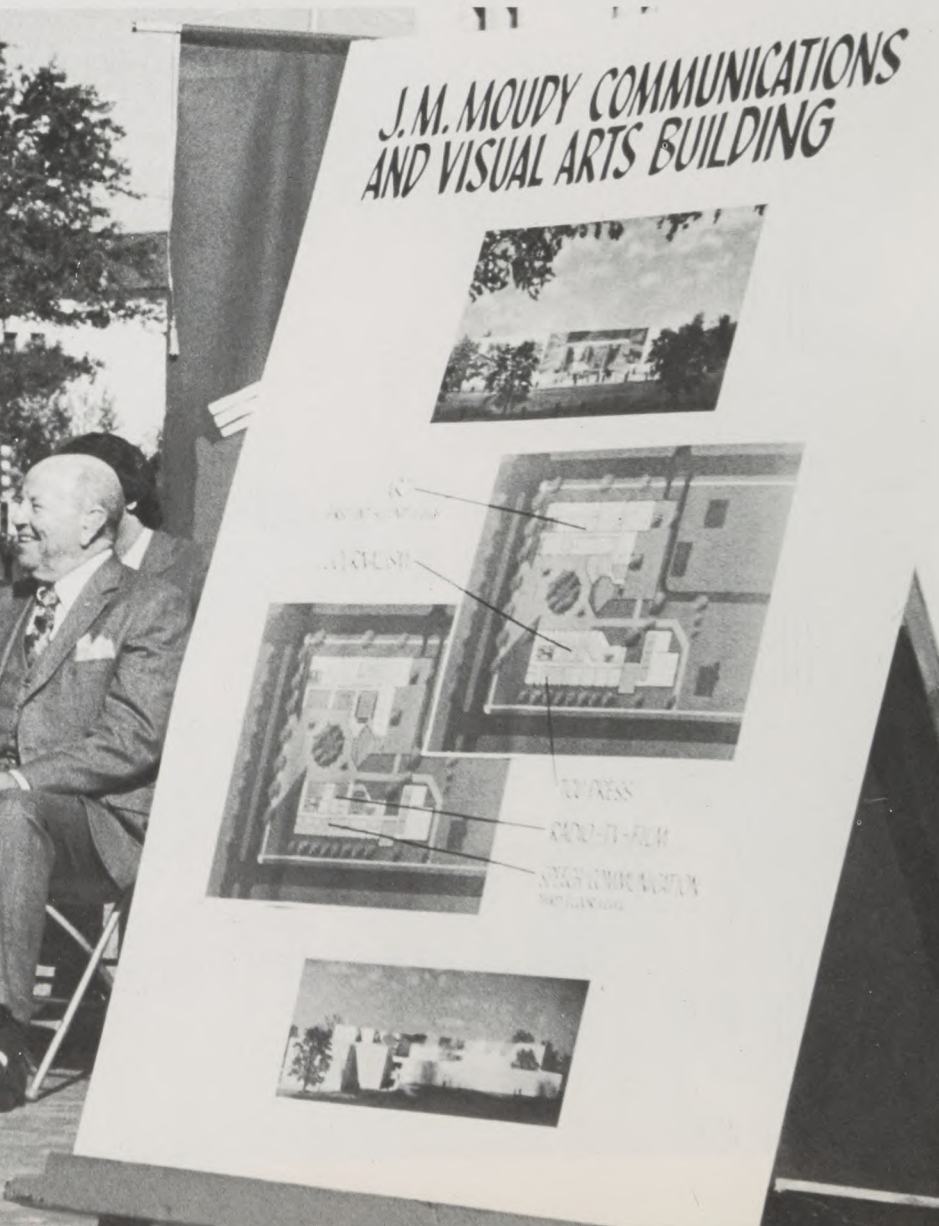
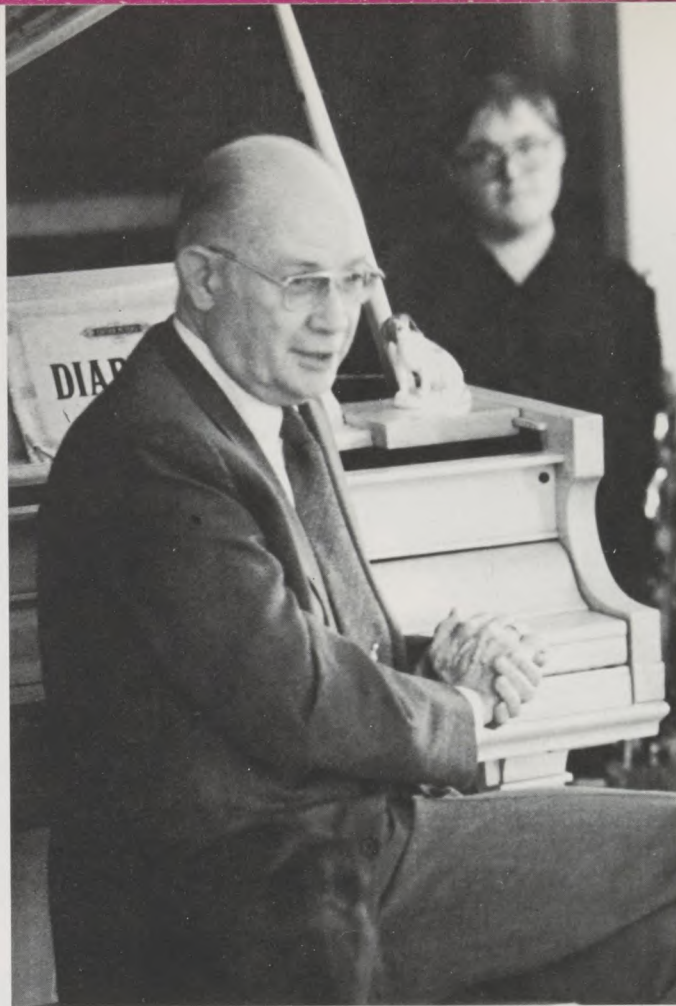
He lodged here long enough to graduate from Brite with honors, then in 1950 he tarried at Duke University, earning his Ph.D.
