Well-known journalists coming for Schieffer School naming ceremony next week

ON TUESDAY, MARCH 8, THE UNIVERSITY will celebrate the naming of the TCU Schieffer School of Journalism after 1959 graduate and internationally-known CBS newsman Bob Schieffer. There will be an 11:30 a.m. naming ceremony and 2 p.m. symposium, both on campus.

In addition to Schieffer, other national journalists attending the events include Tom Brokaw, former *NBC Nightly News* anchor; Bob Woodward, assistant managing editor for *The Washington Post*; Jim Lehrer, host of PBS' *NewsHour*; Tom Friedman, columnist for *The New York Times*; and Larry King, host of *Larry King Live* on CNN. Kate Lehrer, TCU graduate and wife of Jim Lehrer, and Brokaw will participate in the naming ceremony and Brokaw, King, Friedman, Jim Lehrer, and Woodward will participate in the afternoon symposium titled "State of American Journalism."

Due to an overwhelming response, seating is no longer available in Ed Landreth Auditorium, but faculty and staff may view the day's events via live remote in the Brown-Lupton Student Center ballroom. Tickets are required for both events and will be given out on a first come, first-served basis — one ticket per event per person, please, available at the Student Center Information Desk.

Also, TCU campus television Ch. 10 will carry a live broadcast of the day's events. ♦

Library receives significant gift of art and related books

JOHN PAYNE OF AUSTIN, TCU CLASS OF 1963, and his daughter, Dr. Elisa Payne, have donated a major art and literary collection of more than 8,000 volumes to the Mary Coats Burnett Library.

The majority of the collection, around 6,000 volumes, consists of books on art in the United States, Europe, South America, Japan, China, and other Asian countries, supplemented by 32 different art-related periodicals. Other major subject areas include theater and the performing arts, and literary biographies and bibliographies.

The collection also includes subject bibliographies, Texas history, President Richard Nixon and miscellaneous reference books. In addition, there are 770 auction catalogs from Sotheby's and Christie's related to the sale of books, manuscripts, and photographs.

Payne, who majored in psychology and combined sciences at TCU, is a professional appraiser of libraries, archives, and photographs, and a consultant in these fields. He has previously donated many books to his alma mater, but this is by far his largest and most significant gift to TCU.

From 1993 to 1997, Payne and colleague Steven Johnson appraised the papers of President Richard Nixon, a collection of some 45 million documents, 3,700 hours of tape recordings, and other items — the largest archival appraisal ever.

Dr. Elisa Payne is assistant professor of family medicine at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in Fort Smith. She is a graduate of the medical school at the University of Texas Health Science Center in San Antonio. ♦

International expert on speech disorders to speak

THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNICATION sciences and disorders will host its Green Honors Chair public lecture on "Intervention Strategies for Preschool and Primary Children with Speech Sounds Disorders" with Dr. John Bernthal, Thursday, March 3 at 6 p.m. in the Moudy Bldg., rm. 141N. The event is free and open to the public.

Dr. Bernthal is professor and chair of the Department of Special Education and Communication Disorders at the University of Nebraska. He has served in a variety of leadership positions including president of both the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association (ASHA) and the Council on Academic Programs in Communication Sciences and Disorders.

Dr. Bernthal is co-author of the widely used textbook *Articulation and Phonological Disorders*, currently in its fifth edition, and is co-developer of the "Bankson-Bernthal Test of Phonology." He has also authored or co-authored numerous journal articles and book chapters in the areas of phonological disorders and phonological awareness and its relationship to literacy.
