## Brite Divinity School will dedicate student housing complex Thursday

BRITE DIVINITY SCHOOL WILL HOLD dedication ceremonies for its new, \$9.2 million student housing complex at 11 a.m. Thursday, Nov. 16. Named for Robert M. and Prudie Leibrock of Midland, the apartments are located on a 3.7-acre site at Sandage Ave. and McCart Ave., due east of the campus.

Leibrock Village, owned and managed by Brite, will replace three far-flung apartment units which have traditionally housed divinity school students and their families. According to **David Murph** (church relations), it is hoped that a sense of community among Brite students will be created by bringing them together in one residential complex.

The multi-story buff brick buildings contain 56 units of various one- and two-bedroom configurations, designed to accommodate single students as well as families. The apartments will open for students to move into when the spring 2001 semester begins in January.

Architect on the project is F&S Partners of Dallas. Contractor is Linbeck Construction Company of Houston. ♦

## Hunger Week activities unfold for the 18th year

TCU IS HOSTING EVENTS FOR HUNGER Week today through Friday in an effort to raise awareness and funds for the cause of world hunger.

Activities include a hunger jail, canned food drive, construction of a "shantytown" to raise homelessness awareness, hunger chapel, a service project and the annual hunger banquet and auction.

The silent auction fundraiser will be from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. today and tomorrow in the Student Center lounge. Celebrity donations and contributions from faculty and staff will be sold to the highest bidders.

The hunger banquet and auction will be at 7 p.m. Wednesday in the fellowship hall of University Christian Church. Keynote speaker is Bliss W. Browne, founder of Imagine Chicago, an intergenerational initiative to cultivate hope and civic commitment among the people of Chicago.
