ALL FACULTY MEMBERS are requested to make sure that either a white "Admit to Class" card or a red "Add card is in hand for every student in class. If you are not sure on any student an inquiry at the office will bring the desired information.

STUDENTS WERE TO HAVE REMOVED ALL "I" GRADES last Monday, October 11, for all items carried over from the spring and summer. The teachers are urged to turn in their reports on these grades immediately. This will save time and avoid embarrassment for all involved. If a student reports late to remove an "I" grade tell him to petition the Classification Committee. This is the only route through which any extension of time will be granted and even then only bonifide cases can be adjusted.

WE APPRECIATE THE COOPERATION of a number of teachers in reporting absences. We will follow these up as quickly as possible. Sometimes we will need to write letters to the students. If they do not make adjustment please report them again. A carbon copy of each letter will be sent to the teacher.

PLEASE REPORT by Saturday morning, October 13, the names of all students who are definitely failing thus far in their work. Our patrons should be informed where their sons or daughters are failing in their courses. Our counselors need to have a chance to help before it is too late. Our deans need the information that they may serve effectively. You hold the key to the situation.

WATCH YOUR FACULTY BULLETIN closely for names of students dropping all courses. No "Drop" card is issued when all courses are dropped.

THE CABINET MEETS at 4:00 P.M. the first and third Thursdays.

THE CLASSIFICATION COMMITTEE meets at 4:00 P.M. on the second and fourth Thursdays.

OCTOBER 23rd marks the end of the first six weeks of school. Students who expect to drop courses should do so before that date or an "F" will be recorded where the course is not officially dropped.

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MID-SEMESTER EXAMINATIONS will close November 13th. Please plan your work with this in mind. November 13 is the date for the Austin game and November 6 is the date for Centenary trip so no exams should be scheduled on these two days. The mid-semester exams are to be held at the regular class periods with no printed schedule.
