Kellar, President of the Chrysler Corporation, as well as a report from Mr. B. E. Hutchinson, Chairman of the Finance Committee, which will give you some idea of the condition prevailing in their plant now in connection with their strike which could be classed as sabotage. It shows what the NREB legislation has brought about and is doing more to retard business than it is in helping it.

The cartoon which we sent you a few days ago covers a multitude of troubles. This country can never get on its feet and absorb unemployment until these atrocious things are rectified.
