We are in receipt of your invitation to the unveiling of the Will Rogers Equestrian Monument, in Fort Worth, on Tuesday, November 4th.

Much as we would like to be present, it will be impossible because of our plans for that same date at the Will Rogers Memorial in Claremore. As you probably are aware, our Commission, some months ago, invited the Variety Clubs of America to unveil a plaque to the memory of Will Rogers, and this date is the time of the ceremonies.

The Bob Hope radio show is to be moved to Claremore and the national broadcast will be made from there at 9:00 that evening. In addition to this feature there will be the customary memorial services during the afternoon.

It has been our hope that you could be with us on this occasion. Of course we would be delighted to have you and General Eisenhower fly here after your event was concluded, and proper arrangements would be made to facilitate your reaching here, if you find it possible to do so. I am sorry about the conflicting engagements, as we are much interested in the unveiling of the statue and are discussing here now the location of the duplicate of it which you have offered for the Memorial grounds. This is another fine gesture on your part to the memory of a great American, whom we are proud was an Oklahoman.
