
Was very pleased to hear that Mr. Carter had received a letter from the War Prisoners Aid of the YMCA, advising that a cable dated Geneva, September 2nd, had been received, which stated that several Americans in Oflag 64 were visited by their Swedish secretary on August 16th, and in this message they reported "Amon Carter well. Requests 100 cigars monthly".

Can appreciate how glad Mr. Carter was to receive this message and to hear from someone who had actually seen Amon, Jr., but sorry to hear that Amon, Jr. had not received any packages and only three letters since his capture in February, and do hope the cigars begin to get through, as know when one is a regular cigar smoker like he is, they miss a good cigar about as much as anything else.

Do hope you will soon be receiving word that Amon, Jr. is receiving his cigars and letters regularly, and am sure the word Mr. Carter received directly from someone who had contacted his son must have been a great relief to him.
