Dear Betty:

This will introduce to you Mr. Joe Pelich, Architect for the Fort Worth Frontier Centennial. Mr. Pelich will spend Thursday in Los Angeles and has full authority and instructions to carry out the matter of packing and all details in connection with sweet old Will's trophies, which you have been generous enough to permit Fort Worth to have on display in connection with its Frontier Centennial show which opens July 1st.

My suggestion would be to have some expert packer in Los Angeles look after the packing, crating and everything; then, have the same person come to Fort Worth to supervise the unpacking and arrangement of the display. Later, when we are ready to return the collection to you, we would like to have the same man come back to Fort Worth and repack for shipment to you. We shall save all the boxes and crates and in this way get them back to you safely and in good shape.

It is my understanding that Emil and his wife will come to Fort Worth to be in charge of the exhibit. Emil will have as many to cooperate with him as necessary, together with a policeman on duty at all times. The room, in which the exhibit will be located, is separate and distinct from everything else. As a matter of fact, the plan is to try and duplicate your living room insofar as it is possible, thereby enabling the public to see the exhibit the same as it is now in your home.

As soon as you let us know the amount of the insurance, we will have everything protected with fire, theft, tornado and all damages in any manner. Mr. Pelich will arrange for the transportation - either by fast freight or express. As a matter of fact it is our desire to have everything arranged to the entire satisfaction of both you and Oscar.
