Groundbreaking Ceremony Today To Begin Fort Worth Bomber Plant

FORT WORTH, April 17. (AP)—Fort Worth officials and business men will become aids to visiting officials and dignitaries who come here Friday for groundbreaking ceremonies for the \$10,000,000 Lake Worth bomber plant to be operated by Consolidated Aircraft corporation.

General arrangements for the groundbreaking program were completed, with a 30-minute concert by the work projects administration and national youth administration orchestras to precede the ceremonies. The speaking program is due to start at 3 p. m.

More acceptances to invitations to attend the ceremonies were coming in to the chamber of commerce. Among them were Col. William B. Wright, commander of the Meridian air base, designated to represent Lieut. Gen. Delos C. Emmons, commander of general headquarters of the army air

corps; L. C. Elliott, regional director of the civil aeronautics administration, representing Brig. Gen. Donald H. Connally of Washington, administrator of the CAA; James R. D. Eddy of the trades and industrial division of the state board of vocational education, and J. M. Moroney, treasurer of the Dallas Morning News.

With A. A. Lund, president of the chamber of commerce, presiding, and Amon Carter acting as master of ceremonies, the speaking program calls for talks by Mayor McCrary, County Judge Miller, Col. George E. Lovell of

Fort Sam Houston; Brig. Gen. G. C. Brant, chief of the gulf coast air training center at Randolph Field; Capt. Alva D. Bernhard, commandant of the naval air station at Corpus Christi; Col. Lawrence Westbrook of Washington, assistant commissioner of the Works Projects administration; Col. Stanley O. Scott, division army engineer at Dallas; A. M. Hall, vice president of Consolidated Aircraft corporation, and Albert S. Low, vice president of the Austin Construction company.
