Dear Miss Russell:

Your letter of May 10 addressed to Mrs. Amon G. Carter was opened because it was thought that your letter might concern some prisoners of war in Germany and since there is no Mrs. Amon G. Carter, for they were divorced several years ago.

When Mr. Carter's son returns to this country I am sure he will be glad to give you any information he may have about your brother; however, the entire camp of Stalag III-A at Luckenwalde was liberated by the Russian Armies about twelve days before information was received concerning Mr. Carter's son and in all probability your brother will have returned or you will have heard from him before Amon Junior reaches this country. Lieutenant Carter was in the camp a very short time as he had been moved there from Oflag 64 in Poland at the time the Russian Armies advanced through that part of the country.

In any event, any information available will be given to you as it is thoroughly understood how anxious you must be.
