SPECIAL NOTICE TO HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS AND OTHER PROSPECTIVE FRESHMEN

The Summer-Fall Trimester is so arranged that a student may begin his college education July 3 and complete a Trimester of work before the opening of the Winter Trimester on November 1. The accelerated program of three trimesters a year will make it possible to fulfill requirements for a bachelor's degree in less than three years. Those who can not enter on July 3, by all means should enter at the beginning of the Fall Term on August 28. Alert young men and women will appreciate the present urgency of preparing themselves in the shortest possible time.

STUDENTS NOW IN ATTENDANCE

The Summer-Fall Trimester is equivalent in credit value and course offerings to a pre-war semester. The staff will be the regular faculty. Courses will be offered in all departments. Present students should plan to attend the Summer-Fall Trimester if possible, but if not, either the Summer Term or the Fall Term.

ADD-RAN COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES

The curriculum of the Add-Ran College of Arts and Sciences includes all undergraduate courses offered by the University which are acceptable in fulfillment of requirements for the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science:

THE GRADUATE SCHOOL

Additional: Room Deposit of \$6.00 if in Dormitory (refundable), Library Deposit of \$5.00 on first entrance (\$4.00 refundable), and Books. Laboratory fees are indicated under course descriptions. The usual Medical fee of \$7.50 will be charged dormitory students for sixteen weeks, or \$3.75 for eight weeks.

STUDENT LOAD

For the Summer-Fall Trimester of sixteen weeks, the normal load for students who are entering college for the first time will be fifteen semester hours. Other students with an average grade of B on the previous period of work, either here or elsewhere, may register for as many as eighteen semester hours.

For the Summer Term only or the Fall Term only, students who are entering college for the first time are urged to register for six semester hours. As many as nine semester hours for eight weeks will be permitted, but if a B average is not made, the student will be permitted to take no more than a normal load the following term or trimester.

INTERPRETATION OF COURSE NUMBERS

Rank of a course is indicated by the final two digits of the number: Courses numbered 10 through 19 are Freshman, 20 through 29 are Sophomore, 30 through 49 are Junior or Senior, 50 through 99 are Graduate. Semester-hour value is indicated on the first line of each course announcement.

CLASS PERIODS

Unless otherwise specified, classes meet one hour at the time indicated beneath the course description. For convenience, courses are listed by departments arranged in alphabetical order. Courses marked Summer or Fall continue eight weeks; those marked Summer-Fall continue sixteen weeks. If he wishes, a Summer-Fall student may work out a program including courses marked Summer-Fall, Summer, or Fall.
