
Dear Mrs. Deakins:

Carter about Colonel Drake.

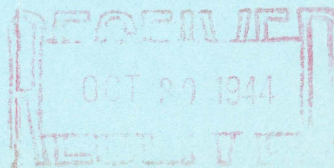
Hope you have heard from Amon, Jr.
