Dear Mr. Schreiner:

Prior to my departure from the city, in going through an accumulation of unanswered mail on my desk I found your letter of June 3rd enclosing a statement by the Y. M. C. A. Commentator, D. A. Davis, for which please accept my sincere thanks.

Naturally, I am anxious to get any information which will enlighten on the conditions and welfare of the German Prison Camps in which my son, Amon Junior is located. He was formerly at Oflag 9 A/Z; however the War Prisoners' Aid of the Y. M. C. A., in New York advised me July 6th that Amon Junior had been moved to Oflag 21-B. Meanwhile, the War Department has advised that he is at Oflag 64 and since we are unable to locate it on the German Prisoner of War Camp map, it must be a new camp and possibly to get the boys out of the bombing area of the Ruhr Valley.

The Y. M. C. A and the American and International Red Cross organizations have been most cooperative and helpful on this matter, I am very grateful for your consideration in my anxiety and worry over my son.
