It is my time to write but it is so cool that I can't hardly be still. I wish you could have been ~~we~~ here to eat breakfast with us we had chicken it was cold just like you like it. Mr Gore brought us a nice watermelon yesterday evening. It was bigger than a water bucket we kept it until this morning. I wish you could have been here to help us eat it we had as much as we could eat Brother carried the mail three or four times and then he quit because Mr Rawlins did not pay him. Mr Gibson fixed the well yesterday. Some times we eat our supper

out on the grass. It will not be
long before we have watermelons
in our garden. It is Mamma's
time to write to morrow. It is going
to rain I think. Ifaisy does not come
up till late. I am getting tired now
and cannot be still any longer
