



Dirt flies as crews start work on summer construction, renovation jobs

CHAIN LINK FENCES AND BARRICADES have made their traditional summer appearance on campus, signaling another round of improvements and new construction.

Will Stallworth, associate vice chancellor for plant management, has provided a partial list of projects already under way or soon-to-be-started:

- The Tucker Technology Center is due to be topped out July 1.

- Waits Hall renovation will be completed and ready for move-in Aug. 1.

- Classroom improvements and upgrades have been a high priority and the number of them getting a makeover is impressive. Floors, ceilings, lighting, teaching walls and furniture will be replaced in classrooms in these buildings: four in the Bailey Bldg., one in ballet, 13 in the Bass Bldg., nine in Beasley, five in Landreth Hall, 19 in Moudy S, two in Moudy N, 10 in Reed, one in Sadler and nine in Winton-Scott.

- Demolition of the tennis courts behind the Rickel Bldg., the racquetball courts and the swimming office will begin June 1 as renovation of the east half of the Rickel begins. Construction will begin in August.

- Buildings on Princeton Street have been leveled as the former sites of TCU Police, TCU Press, extended education and university services, to make way for a proposed 550-car parking garage. Until that structure is built, a temporary parking lot for 90 cars will fill the Princeton Street space.

- Roof repairs are scheduled for human resources, library, Tager TV, the tower of Amon Carter Stadium and the Worth Hills dining hall.

- Heating and air-conditioning improvements to Ed Landreth Hall will correct longtime problems with humidity in that building.

- Air handler units in the Moudy Bldgs. will be replaced.

- Lights will be installed in the freshman parking lot.

- A fire alarm system will be installed in the Bailey Bldg. and Daniel-Meyer Coliseum.

- The Health Center is being renovated. Limited services are being offered in a trailer behind Colby Hall until the facility reopens Aug. 15.

- A sprinkler system will be installed in the Bass Bldg. and the religion complex.

- A new elevator will be installed in Winton-Scott

- Interiors of Milton-Daniel and Moncrief Halls will be painted. Jarvis Hall will be carpeted and some windows will be replaced.

- The drainage ditch at Worth Hills will be covered over.

Construction updates will be printed in *TCU This Week* throughout the summer, regularly e-mailed to faculty and staff and also included in the "TCU Announce" listings on the Web. ♦

TCU scholarships will go to TCC's top math students

TCU HAS ESTABLISHED A TWO-YEAR, full-tuition scholarship to be offered each year to the district winner of the Tarrant County College Jim Bolen Math Competition.

Garrett Hollander, a student at TCC Northeast, is the first recipient.

The scholarship honors longtime TCC mathematics professor Jim Bolen, late brother of **Bob Bolen** (senior advisor to the Chancellor and former mayor of Fort Worth). It is one of many scholarships and financial aid programs TCU offers exclusively to the TCC student body.

"TCU is proud to extend its long-standing cooperation with TCC through providing opportunities to TCC students to continue their academic success on the university level," Chancellor **Michael R. Ferrari** said.

"Jim Bolen was a master teacher whose mission was to foster excellence in his math students at TCC and to reward their achievement," TCC Chancellor Leonardo de la Garza said. "TCC has enjoyed a long-standing partnership with TCU, and this scholarship not only strengthens that bond, but also allows one of TCC's brightest students the opportunity to continue at one of the finest universities in the nation." ♦
